We are continuing to update our policies but sometimes as soon as we update they are out dated.

Registration deadlines and deposit due dates will be strictly followed. It's very important travelers understand the necessity of registering early and committing to a tour to ensure the success of a guaranteed departure. Koinonia requires 30 registered travelers with deposits paid to guarantee a domestic motor-coach tour. Koinonia requires 20 registered with deposits paid for an international tour. We do offer guaranteed departures for some tours planned with our partner tour operators. Be aware that some tours will require deposits a year in advance to reserve space!

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: GENERAL GUIDELINES, RESERVATION POLICIES, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

(Please read carefully before signing up for a tour, your reservation constitutes acceptance of our policies.)

Koinonia Travels and Tours purpose is to strive to create unique, carefree, extraordinary travel experiences with lasting memories for individuals and groups while offering unsurpassed value and exceptional quality with personalized service. We desire to be the best travel professionals and providers in the travel industry. The following polices and guidelines are designed to help us accomplish our purpose.

Responsibilities: All tours are arranged and operated by Koinonia Travels and Tours (KTT) (LLC). KTT acts only as your agent in arranging and sponsoring the various accommodations that are made available, and assumes no responsibility nor liability in connection with the services rendered by any vessel, carriage or other conveyance, excursions, sightseeing events, restaurants, hotels or motels or any other accommodation, event or equipment used in the performance of the tour. KTT assumes no responsibility for any delay, accident, failure or sickness incurred while using any leased services.

KTT reserves the right to make changes in the itinerary or tour arrangements at any time, due to emergency or otherwise unknown situations. If KTT cancels a tour, it shall have no responsibility to participants beyond the refund of the monies paid to KTT by the participants. In case of events beyond our control, including but not limited to strikes, lockouts, revolts, wars, natural disasters, fires, closures of airports or hotels, or technical problems of transport, which force us to cancel the tour you have booked, you will be entitled to a full refund minus reasonable expenses for services performed. In any of the above cases, KTT shall not be under any other obligation of liability to participants. KTT reserves the right to alter the itinerary or arrangements deemed necessary without penalty. Time restraints including traffic and weather or mechanical failure of equipment beyond our control shall be deemed conditions for change. KTT shall be under no liability because of cancellation of any event, show, game or activity that is cancelled due to weather or any other condition beyond KTT's control. KTT reserves the right to make any corrections deemed necessary to any printed or electronic distributed materials. We reserve the right to accept or decline any person as a member of any tour at any time.

Reservations:

How far in advance do I need to make a reservation? We suggest reservations be made as soon as your vacation schedule is known. Many people wait too long and are disappointed that the date they want has been sold out. Most festival tours have only limited departures and are sold out long in advance. We feel that you do yourself and KTT an immense favor by making your reservations as soon as possible. How do I make a reservation? 1) Select the KTT tour of your choice and the date that is most convenient for you. 2) Call our local number and confirm your reservation. 3) Complete the reservation form available on-line or we can mail or fax you a form. Mail completed reservation form along with your deposit check, made payable to KTT within 10 days of making your reservation. Your seat will be confirmed and guaranteed once we receive your deposit and reservation form. KTT will guarantee a departure once the required numbers are registered for a tour.

Required Deposits – Final Payments:

Deposits are due within 10 days after making your reservation. Names will be removed from the trip roster if deposit is not received. **Separate checks should be sent for each tour booked.**Tours priced from \$0—\$1500..... \$250 Deposit
Tours priced over \$1500....... \$500 Deposit

Tours that include a cruise or airfare may have different deposit requirements. Many are requiring non-refundable deposits.

Final payment for all motor coach tours is due no later than 45 days prior to departure. Please mark your calendar with the due date. Individuals who register for a tour with less than 45 days prior to departure must pay full amount when registering. No refunds with cancelation 45 days or less from departure. Final payments on all tours involving air travel and cruise lines are due 90 days from departure unless otherwise notified. Please be aware that Cruise Lines', Airlines' and Travel Vendors' cancellation polices, deposits, refunds vary and we must follow each one's policies. Cancellation Policy: Special Note: Vendors Policy will take priority over Koinonia Policies when making reservations for both international and domestic tours. Group polices with vendors in the travel industry, such as transportation, lodging, restaurants and attractions are constantly changing.

We at KTT understand that at times, due to uncontrollable circumstances, it may become necessary for you to cancel a tour. In the event that cancellation does become necessary, the following policy will apply: KTT will have to charge any non-recoverable expenditures made on behalf of the participant at the time of cancellation. These costs would be for tickets, meals, hotels, airline, cruises, etc. Many vendors such as airline companies, cruise lines, motor-coach, hotels, restaurants, and theaters require non-refundable deposits and payments in advance. Many times these monies are totally non-recoverable. In addition to any non-recoverable expenditure, there will be a \$30 handling fee withheld on all cancellations regardless of the reason to cover the cost of postage, processing, faxes, administrative and telephone expenses. Motor-coach Tour Cancellations made 45-days or less prior to tour departure will be subject to the entire cost of the tour. International Tour Cancellations made 100 days or less prior to departure will be subject to entire cost of tour. Once the tour departs, no refunds will be made. Refunds are not given for any meals or attractions in which the traveler does not participate while on tour. Koinonia reserves the right to cancel any tour for conditions beyond our control including insufficient participation. Travel Insurance recommended!

Final Tour Information: Once final payment has been made for tours you will receive travel documents with final tour information in the mail or via email no later than two weeks before departure. Name tags, luggage tags and other necessary information will be handed out on the first day of tour unless it is an international tour. Most international tours will have a final briefing meeting to distribute the documents or they will be mailed to you.

Each tour's Itinerary will list the inclusions for that tour including meals, admissions, transportation, guides, sightseeing, accommodations and gratuities.

Personal Expenses are the responsibility of the passenger. This also includes expenses incurred due to flight cancellations or delays, technical faults, weather conditions, political closures, local events, traffic conditions, etc.

Tobacco Products, Alcohol or Firearms are not allowed on Motor-Coaches. This is due to State and Federal Law! NO EXCEPTIONS!

Seat Rotation: This assures equal opportunity for each tour member to view scenery from different locations on coach and to fellowship with all travelers.

Travel Insurance is always recommended for both international and domestic travel. You should consider purchasing once the trip is declared a guaranteed departure!! Protect your investment and feel more confident when traveling internationally. Please read the travel insurance information section.



 - 9. Thou are welcome in every city, treat thy people with respect, and thou shall be an honored guest!
 - 10. Thou shall remember no one can ruin your day without your permission!

Travel Insurance:

What is it? Do I need it? What does it cover? How much does it cost? When should I buy it? I hear these questions often from our travelers. Travelers are thinking more about travel insurance because of the amount of investment and the uncertainties in life. You've registered for a trip, you're excited about traveling but you understand whether you are at home or traveling, life happens-which can affect your travel plans! You want to protect your investment.

Travel insurance becomes a safety net and without it traveling is a bit of a gamble: Can you afford to lose your investment in the trip or pay for medical cost? It's becoming necessary for all international travel and more travelers are interested in protecting their investment while traveling in the United States. Whether you are at home or on vacation, life happens – and that can affect your travel plans. You or your child may get sick and you have to cancel your trip. The airlines may lose your luggage. You may miss your flight connection and lose days in your destination. You could have an accident, get sick and need medical attention – from physicians who don't speak English. A good travel insurance plan provides coverage for all of these situations and more – any time you go 100+ miles from home. I've personally seen it get very costly for travelers without insurance! I've also seen where travelers were taken very good care of because they had coverage. It offers peace of mind!

There are many different types of coverage available. Please review a plan's Description of Coverage before you buy – or call the company to speak with a representative about your specific situation. I will provide a number where you can talk to an expert and ask all your questions. Important!!!!! Most companies require you to purchase insurance within two weeks of your deposit to have the pre-existing conditions waived!!!!!

Types of Coverage: While specific policies may vary, travel insurance generally covers:

- Trip Cancellation, with the possible option to upgrade to Cancel For Any Reason
- Trip Interruption, Trip Delay, and Missed Connection
- Baggage Protection
- Emergency Accident and Sickness
- Evacuation and Repatriation of Mortal Remains
- Hazardous Sports Coverage
- Accidental Death and Dismemberment

KOINONIA TRAVELERS:

Anytime you buy insurance, you should understand its coverages and limitations before you buy!!!!!

I suggest travel insurance for all my trips! I work with a couple different companies I believe offer good plans at a reasonable rate and have a very good reputation in the industry. They also allow me to use the trip confirmation date as the deposit date. That 's the date I announce we have the numbers and the trip is a definite go! Most companies have a pre-existing condition wavier if you purchase your insurance within a certain time frame after making a trip deposit, usually 7-14 days. The pre-existing condition waiver can be a valuable benefit for travelers with pre-existing conditions.

I can also request individual quotes for travelers. Cost is based on the age of the traveler, cost of the trip and the duration of the trip. Once you decide to purchased insurance you can contact me with your date of birth, contact information and I will request a quote and it will be sent to you via email or phone call. Please, I encourage to look around and compare companies, you may share my name as your travel provider. You may visit my website and click on the travel insurance icon and request a quote. You just provide them with trip information and they will email you the quote and you can purchase online.

Remember: Ask your questions and make sure you understand all the guidelines and benefits of Travel Protection Insurance!

A Big Taste of Texas

The Pioneer Woman (Ree Drummond), Magnolia Market @ Silo's (Chip & Joanna Gaines), Dallas, Ft. Worth, Waco, San Antonio, Houston April 21sth - 30th, 2024

Day 1: Travel day to Joplin, Mo. Day 2: PAWHUSKA, OK • THE PIONEER WOMAN MERCANTILE: We spend the day today in the home town of the Pioneer Woman, Ree Drummond. First we start off with a tour of Osage and a visit out to The Lodge on the Drummond Ranch. The Lodge is their family guest house and also serves as the production location for Ree's Food Network show! (If The Pioneer Woman is taping for TV, we will not be able to visit the lodge.) We will have lunch on our own and then spend the afternoon shopping at The Pioneer Woman's Mercantile. "The Merc" has gorgeous goods, comfort foods, freshmade pastries, delicious coffee, and plenty of fun to dish out. Tonight we have an included dinner at The Mercantile. Day 3: DALLAS, TX • DALLAS ARBORETUM & BOTANICAL GARDENS: Today we travel south into the heart of Texas. The Dallas Arboretum and Botanical Garden is a world-class, 66-acre urban oasis featuring 19 finely manicured gardens. Take a stroll through one of the most beautiful outdoor attractions featuring spectacular display gardens that showcase incredible seasonal flowers, ornamental shrubs, trees and plant collections in a serene setting on White Rock Lake. Day 4: This morning we do a city tour of Dallas were we stop at Pioneer Plaza to see the larger-than-life bronze cattle drive. Then visit the Sixth Floor Museum which displays an interesting exhibition on the life, death, and legacy of President Kennedy. It is here, in the former Texas School Book Depository, that Lee Harvey Oswald supposedly fired his # fatal shots. This afternoon we arrive in Fort Worth. It's apparent the Old West is thriving in the **Stockyards** National Historic District. See a real Texas Longhorn cattle drive down Exchange Avenue and enjoy the authenticity of the Stockyards. Day 5: WACO GUIDED TOUR • MAGNOLIA MARKET AT THE SILOS • DR. PEPPER MUSEUM: This morning we head to Waco, TX, the Hometown of Chip & Joanna Gaines. We start our day with a guided tour of Waco, stopping at all the familiar spots from their HGTV's Fixer Upper show. We will see some of their fixer upper homes, visit Jimmy Don's Metal Works and stop by Harp Design Wood Shop. After the tour, we will have free time to have lunch on your own and shopping at Magnolia Market & Silos. Located just a few blocks from the Magnolia Market, the Dr. Pepper Museum is housed in a historic three story bottling plant. We will take a guided tour of the original bottling facility, and sample some hand-made Dr. Pepper from their old fashioned soda fountain. Day 6: This morning we visit the Texas Ranger Museum. Here we will find out about these famous lawmen who have been called one of the most effective investigative law enforcement agencies in the world. We then head south to Fredericksburg and visit The National Museum of the Pacific War, the only institution in the continental United States dedicated exclusively to telling the story of the Pacific Theater Battles of World War II. Hopefully time will allow us to visit Lyndon Johnson National Historic Park and Luckenbach, TX. Day 7: SAN ANTO-NIO / ALAMO / RIVER WALK. San Antonio is the 7th largest city in the United States and is one of the fastest growing metropolitan areas. We'll understand why when we get a glimpse of this beautiful and unique city as we explore with a guide and enjoy this stately old city. Highlights of the day include a visit to The Alamo, established in 1718 as the city's first mission and called the "Cradle of Texas Liberty." Stops at the Mission San Jose and San Fernando Cathedral will show the influence of the missions. We visit the Institute of Texas Culture, which emphasizes the contributions of the 26 ethnic groups that helped settle Texas. This evening enjoy a relaxing boat ride on the San Antonio River. Visit the Paseo Del Rio or River Walk where shops, restaurants, boutiques, and vendors line the banks of the river. Day 8: Today we start back east with a stop in Houston to visit this historic and lovely city. A local guide will give us a tour of this cosmopolitan city with its parks and residential areas lined with big live oak trees and beautiful homes. 950 bikes can be seen on any given day, and 200 different manufacturers from 20 countries are represented in the collection—from Harley-Davidson, Honda, and Indian—to Showa, DSK, and Cagiva. The museum also features the world's most extensive Lotus collection, anchored by the Lotus 21. The museum also displays rare racecars, including the 1964 Ferrari F-158, in which John Surtees won the 1964 Formula 1 Driver's World Championship. We arrive home this evening with new friends and many memories of a fantastic tour with Koinonia. towns, rugged western towns, picturesque and quaint villages, cosmopolitan cites and world famous ornate landscape gardens!

Day 1: Travel Day: This morning we travel to Vancouver to begin our magical tour of the Canadian Rockies. Vancouver, with its dramatic location between the Rocky Mountains and the Pacific Ocean, is sure to inspire you. Flight to Valcouver. Flights can be booked individual or as a group with Koinonia. Watch moose lazily wander the shoreline and look for other wildlife that is native to the area. We return to Jasper in time to explore the town.

Day 7: ATHABASCA FALLS • COLUMBIA ICEFIELDS SNOW COACH • LAKE LOUISE • BANFF GONDOLA: This morning we travel along the Icefields Parkway, one of the most spectacular drives in the world. You will marvel at the towering snowcapped peaks, azure lakes, thundering waterfalls, and hanging glaciers. You may even spot wildlife. Day 1: Travel Day: Welcome aboard your motor-coach as we begin our incredible westward journey. Relax and get acquainted with fellow travelers as we make of way to Ft. Smith, Arkansas.

Day 2: FT. Smith, Arkansas- Oklahoma City, OK: We begin our day with a visit to Fort Smith National Historical Site. You can walk where soldiers drilled, pause along the Trail of Tears, and stand where justice was served. The park includes the remains of two frontier forts and the Federal Court for the Western District of Arkansas. Explore life on the edge of frontier and Indian Terricory through the stories of soldiers, the Trail of Tears, scandals, outlaws, and lawmen who pursued them. From the establishment of the first Fort Smith on December 25, 1817, to the final days of Judge Isaac C. Parker's jurisdiction over Indian Territory in 1896, Fort Smith National Historic Site preserves many years of history. We continue driving through Oklahoma arriving in Oklahoma City or a visit to The National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum which opened in 1965. The National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum preserves and interprets the evolving history and cultures of the American West for education and enrichment of its di-




verse audiences. It has more than 28,000 Western and American Indian art works and artifacts. The Museum, with its Rodeo Hall of Fame, is a leading destination for rodeo and Western culture enthusiasts. The facility also has the world's most extensive collection of American rodeo photographs, barbed wire, saddlery, and early rodeo trophies plus the grounds are beautifully landscaped to enjoy a peaceful walk.

Day 3: We continue west to **Albuquerque**, the metropolis of New Mexico, spread out before the dramatic Sandia Mountains. Past and present mingle here. Old Town, the original Albuquerque was founded in 1706 and still has that original flavor with a plaza and San Felipe de Meri Church. The warmth of aged adobe buildings adds a special charm to the shops galleries restaurants and hidden patios. The Sandia Peak Tramway is an aerial tram which lofts passengers to the top of Sandia

Peak over 10,000 feet. The 2.7 mile ride is the longest clear and unsupported span in North America. The view both east and west s spectacular.

Day 4: PETRIFIED FOREST, PAINTED DESERT NP: See the most spectacular display of petrified wood in the world in the 93,493 acres of national park. You will look at tree trunks of solid stone that range in age up to 100 million years old? You will have awesome views of mesas, pinnacles and canyons. We also traverse a portion of the Painted Dessert. The Painted Desert is an expanse of padland hills, flat-topped mesas and buttes. It is an arid land, sparsely vegetated and heavily eroded. The name Painted Desert refers to the rainbow of colorful sedimentary layers exposed in the austere and scape. The landforms of the Painted Desert have been described as a multicolored layer cake.







lined from one end to the other with glittering hotels, night clubs, and casinos. Just when you think you've seen it all, darkness falls and it becomes a whole new place. This evening you will have some options: You may consider adding an exciting 3 1/2 hour "Bright Lights Jeep Tour" of Las Vegas or an exciting evening show.

Day 6: Las Vegas, NV to St Georges/Springdale UT: Today we leave the glittering neon lights and head north to St George/Springdale Utah. This area is a desert prelude to the National and State Parks we will be visiting. Nestled beneath Pine Valley Mountain is a mixture of desert scenery, red rock cliffs, buttes, rolling hills, and mountains. The terrain here follows more of the arid desert mystique while breaking it up with some beautiful red rock features found in the local bluffs and hills.

Day 7: Begin today in Zion National Park, where the Virgin River has cut a dramatic rugged gorge through multi-hued sandstone, shale and limestone. Admire the towering rock walls surrounding

you while riding through the park. Desert terrain and huge, sculpted rock formations coexist with waterfalls and hanging gardens in this spectacular gorge carved through strangely colored sandstone, shale and limestone. We'll follow scenic Mt. Carmel Highway through the One Mile Tunnel to Zion National Park. The Mormons called this spectacular outdoor wonderland the "Heavenly City of Sod," because its massive formations of extremely vertical rock looked like huge cathedrals and thrones. Lake West Temple rises to 7,795 feet. Driving through the park road, we are surrounded by the narrow, steep walls of side canyons, which branch out in all directions from the main gorge, showcasing a constant changing of colors. After seeing one of the park's more noted landmarks, the Temple of Sinawava, a natural amphitheater surrounded by pink cliffs, we exit the park to the west.


Located in the Dixie National Forest is Bryce Canyon National Park. Though it's much smaller than Zion, Bryce has its own brand of unique beauty, featuring weird-looking formations known as hoodoos. These formations undergo a constant change of color from the reflection of sunlight hitting at different angles. From the rim drive, the oddly shaped rocks and cliffs resemble castles, animals, people, and houses. We continue to Page, Arizona, home of the Glen Canyon Dam on the Colorado River.

The dam forms spectacular Lake Powell, a 196-mile-long dazzling blue oasis in the middle of

the desert.

Day 8: Page, Lake Powell, Slot Canyon, Horse Shoe Bend: Today visit the iconic and majestic viewpoint at Horseshoe Bend. This leisurely .6 mile hike leads to one of the most spectacular views of the Colorado River as it meanders through the colorful rock. Later, you will see the massive Glen Canyon Dam and take a cruise on sky-blue Lake Powell through Glen Canyon National Recreation Area. Then it's off to explore a slot canyon. A slot canyon is a long, narrow gorge/channel or drainage way with sheer rock walls that are typically eroded into ei-

> ther sandstone or other sedimentary rock. They are named for their narrow width, often squeezing down to a sliver.



Day 9: Monument Valley, Cedars SP, Moab: Today we visit the incredible Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park, where numerous Western movies, television shows and commercials have been filmed. Monument Valley (Navajo: Tsé Bii' Ndzis-

gaii, pronounced [tshépì:? htshskài:], meaning valley of the rocks. The valley is considered sacred by the Navajo Nation. We experience the park with a Navajo guide while riding a costumed built four wheel drive jeep. A traditional Navaio lunch in the valley will be an experience not soon forgotten. Monument Valley is not a valley at all, but ra-

ther a wide, flat landscape interrupted by colorful red buttes and spires rising hundreds of feet into the air. These are the last remnants of the sedimentary rock layers that once covered the entire region. Monument Valley is contained entirely within the Navajo reservation, occupying both Utah and Arizona. This is one of the most remarkable, beautiful and famous landscapes in the world. NEXT STOP: EDGE OF THE CEDARS STATE PARK MUSEUM: In ancient times, canyons in this area were home to a large number of native Pueblo People (Anasazi) The museum was built at the site of an ancient village which included dwelling units and a kiva. The kiva and some other structures have been restored and can be viewed behind the museum. View the largest collection of Ancestral Puebloan (Anasazi) pottery on display in the Four Corners Region and explore an authentic Puebloan village behind the museum.



Day 10: Dead Horse Point SP, Arches NP; Float trip, Grand Junction: We visit Arches National Park, a timeless, natural landscape of giant stone arches, pinnacles, spires, fins and windows, once the bed of an ancient sea. The power of erosion has laid bare the skeletal structure of the earth in Arches National Park. The park contains the largest concentration of stone arches in the world. We witness breathtaking views divided by massive canyons of the Green and Colorado Rivers as we make a brief visit to Dead Horse Point State Park. Enjoy the beautiful surroundings of "Canyonlands National Park" and learn about the legend of the name. According to one legend, around the turn of the century, the point was used as a corral for wild

mustangs roaming the mesa top. Cowboys rounded up horses, herded them across the narrow neck of land and onto the point. The neck, which is only 30-yards-wide, was then fenced off with branches and brush. Hopefully we have time to enjoy a float trip on the Colorado River where your oarsman relates tales of the Fisher Towers and Professor Valley.

Day 11: Denver: No matter which way you look you will see incredibly beautiful mountain vistas as we travel east to Denver. When we arrive in the Mile High City we will take some time to explore and learn about its history as we view the sites before dinner and checking into our hotel.

Day 12: Abilene, Kansas City: We begin our journey Home with many new memories and friends!! What a wonderful, exciting, amazing, journey full of adventure! We make our

way across the plains of Kansas with a stop in Abilene to visit the Boyhood home and museum of our 34th president Dwight "IKE" Eisenhower.

Day 13: Homeward Bound: Today is a travel day that takes us home. We will be tired but enthusiastic about our journey together and all the places we visited and the memories created. It's a good time to reminisce and think about your next journey with Koinonia.

Day 1: Early today we board our comfortable Prevost motor-coach and head north. We will spend the day getting to know our fellow travelers as our route takes us through beautiful mountain terrain.

Day 2: HUDSON RIVER VALLEY • HYDE PARK • FRANKLIN ROO-SEVELT HOME, LIBRARY AND MUSEUM • ALBANY: Today we travel up the Hudson River Valley on our way to Albany. In Hyde Park we visit the home of Franklin Roosevelt, maintained as it was at his death in 1945. Our 32nd President and his wife Eleanor are buried in

the Rose Garden. The Library and Museum contain his papers, gifts, books, ship models, and personal belongings.

Day 3: BENNINGTON BATTLE MONUMENT • GRANDMA MOSES SCHOOLHOUSE • BENNINGTON MUSEUM • HILDENE: Today's sightseeing begins in Bennington, Vermont, headquarters for Ethan Allen's Green Mountain Boys, known to the Yankees as the "Bennington Mob." Bennington Museum is one of the country's finest regional museums, featuring a large collection of old Bennington pottery, a very rare collection of American blown and pressed glass, the oldest Stars and Stripes in existence, rare documents, costumes, uniforms, and furnishings. On this property is the

Grandma Moses Schoolhouse. Her furniture, paintings, and memorabilia complete the schoolhouse. Also today we enjoy the splendor of the Green Mountains, which cover a quarter of a million acres in Vermont. This afternoon we visit Hildene, the stately home of Robert Todd Lincoln. The Georgian Revival mansion contains original furnishings, a 1,000 pipe organ and family memorabilia.

Day 4: NEW HAMPSHIRE: Today we enjoy the beautiful fall foliage in the White Mountains of New Hampshire where the views are magnificent. The itinerary today will include many interesting stops and we will enjoy as much as possible as time permits. We'll stop at Fadden's General Store & Maple Sugarhouse or similar. We'll tour the sugar house and have an opportunity to sample and purchase products. This evening our lodging will be on the Atlantic coast.



Day 5: NUBBLE LIGHTHOUSE • KENNEBUNKPORT • PORTLAND HEAD LIGHT • L. L. BEAN • BOOTHBAY HARBOR • LOBSTER DINNER: Shortly after we depart the hotel, we cross into the beautiful state of Maine. This morning we'll travel on the coastal highway, Route 1, viewing portions of the scenic rocky coastline. Our first stop is at Cape Neddick where we view the Nubble Lighthouse. From here we travel through the quaint village of Kennebunkport. We'll drive slowly by Walker's Pointe, where we'll see President George and First Lady Barbara Bush's summer home. Our next stop is Cape Elizabeth. Here we'll have an excellent view of the Portland Head Light. Have your cam-

eras ready - this is the Rocky Coast of Maine! This afternoon we will stop at L. L. Bean, one of America's largest mail order houses featuring clothing, accessories and merchandise for the outdoorsman and campers. Then continue along the rocky coast to Boothbay Harbor. Tonight we enjoy some "down east" cooking at one of the area's seafood restaurants.

Day 6: BAR HARBOR • ACADIA NATIONAL PARK • CADILLAC MOUNTAIN • GRANITE COASTLINE • ST JOHN: Today we continue along Highway 1, enjoying the rugged coast. Noon finds us in Bar Harbor, the largest town on Mount Desert Island — one of the most beautiful islands on the Atlantic Coast. Here is Acadia National Park, one of America's most beautiful parks. This is the Maine of the storybooks. Waves come crashing against the granite coastline of Cadillac Moun-

tain, the highest point on the Atlantic coast. From the top you'll experience beauty unlike any you've ever seen before! We could remain here forever, but soon we must continue on our way into Canada. When we arrive at the border in Calais, you are half way to the North Pole from the Equator. The 45th parallel passes a few miles south of town on US Highway 1 near Perry. We overnight in Saint John.

Day 7: PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND TOUR • ANNE OF GREEN GABLES HOUSE • LOBSTER SUPPER: We take the Confederation Bridge to Prince Edward Island. Arriving on the island, we follow Highway 1 through potato fields and farming areas to Charlottetown. We tour the lush farmlands, pass tiny fishing hamlets, and cross the wooded slopes of Prince Edward Island. You'll view deep coves lashed by ocean waves, and marvel at sandy beaches, stark red capes, and green hills. We travel by the home of Lucy Maude Montgomery, author of the Anne of Green Gables series. Tonight we will travel out in the countryside for a lobster feast.



Day 8: ALEXANDER GRAHAM BELL MUSEUM: This morning we must say goodbye to Prince Edward Island as we board the ferry back to the mainland and travel north to Cape Breton Island. This afternoon we visit the Alexander Graham Bell Museum. We explore the fascinating museum before checking in for two nights' lodging on Cape Breton Island.

Day 9: CABOT TRAIL • LUNCH AT KELTIC LODGE: Today we travel the Cabot Trail, often described as the most spectacular drive in North America. Take a deep breath---the scenery is unsurpassed! See awesome views from windswept peaks, infinite steeps of saw tooth rock, lonely beaches, and heart-stopping drops down

sheer cliff-sides. We pass small fishing villages along the Gulf of St. Lawrence to the Cape Breton Highlands National Park. We climb sharply over 1,116 feet, taking in the magnificent views of the Gulf, then travel east along the plateau overlooking the Atlantic. The shore is rocky, identified with numerous coves at the mouths of picturesque valleys. A memorable lunch is included today at Keltic Lodge.

Day 10: MARINE DRIVE • HALIFAX • MARITIME MUSEUM: This morning we take the Canso Causeway back to the mainland. At Antigonish we head back to the Atlantic Ocean. The Marine Eastern Shore Drive is as close as you can get without getting wet. The tang of salt air and the solitary cry of the gull are the signature of this drive leading to Dartmouth and Halifax. We visit the Maritime Museum of the Atlantic which maintains a nautical and marine history of Atlantic Canada. The permanent exhibits include "Titanic: The Unsinkable Ship" and "Halifax, Halifax Wrecked: The Story of the Halifax Explosion," a ship chandlery, Shipwrecks and Lifesaving, Days of Sail gallery and much more. We stay in the capital city of Halifax tonight. Enjoy your surroundings this evening for a walk and dining on your own.

Day 11: HALIFAX CITY TOUR • PEGGY'S COVE • LUNCH • LIGHTHOUSE TRAIL: We begin the day with a guided tour of the legendary city of Halifax. See the famous Citadel, surrounded by a dry moat, marvel at the Old Town Clock, admire Point Pleasant Park, stroll the Public Gardens, and more before we turn south to Peggy's Cove. This unique, picturesque place of beauty is a must. It is probably the most photographed spot on the Atlantic coast. After a seafood luncheon at the restaurant here, we turn south to explore the Lighthouse Trail on our way to Yarmouth for our overnight stay.



Day 12: FERRY • YARMOUTH TO BAR HARBOR • PORTLAND: This morning we board the ferry from Yarmouth to Bar Harbor. Upon arrival in Bar Harbor, we travel to Portland for our overnight.

Day 13: PHILADELPHIA • INDEPENDENCE HALL: We drive south to Philadelphia this morning and spend the afternoon at Independence National Historic Park, "the most historic square mile in America," which will give us a fascinating insight into the splendor of colonial times. Within the park see Independence Hall and the Liberty Bell.

Day 1: FLIGHT TO DUBLIN, IRELAND: Today we travel to the Airport where we board our overnight flight across the Atlantic to the jewel of Western Europe, Ireland. We are about to begin an exciting journey in this emerald isle with its myths and beauty.









Day 2: ARRIVE DUBLIN • TRINITY COLLEGE • THE BOOK OF KELLS:

We explore the remains of one of the most important monastic sites in Ireland, founded by St. Kevin in the 6th century. We walk through the deep valley to view the picturesque ruins of a round tower, churches, and Celtic crosses. We head southeast to the Dunbrody Famine Ship, an authentic reproduction of an 1840's vessel that brought desperate Irish emigrants fleeing famine to the New World. We then continue on to our hotel in Waterford, where before dinner we take a gentle guided stroll around the narrow streets of this historic city. (B, D)

Day 4: WATERFORD CRYSTAL • COBH • BLARNEY CASTLE: Today we witness the creation of crystal masterpieces during our visit to the House of Waterford Crystal. We then travel to Cobh for our guided walking tour of this harbor town, which was the last port of call for the Titanic in 1912 and was also the main point of embarkation for Irish emigrants between 1848 and 1960. We proceed to Blarney, to visit Blarney Castle and kiss the famous "Stone of Eloquence" or explore the tranquil gardens. We journey west through rugged countryside for a delicious meal and two night stay in Killarney. (B,D)

Day 5: RING OF KERRY • KILLARNEY: Discover the beauty of this Emerald Isle as our drive takes us through scenery of plunging cliffs and spectacular lakes, between granite mountains and endless beaches on our tour of the Ring of Kerry, Ireland's most scenic coastal drive. We will have plenty of photo stops along the way. We stop for lunch, take a stroll around Sneem and enjoy amazing panoramic views at Moll's Gap. Take a scenic, traditional horse-drawn jaunting car to Ross Castle and the Kenmare Estate. We have the evening at leisure to enjoy a delicious meal at one of Killarney's many restaurants. (B, L)

Day 6: CLIFFS OF MOHER • GALWAY: Today we embark on a ferry ride across the River Shannon Estuary. Day 9: Belfast to Dublin: Down Cathedral | The St Patrick Centre | Crumlin Road Gaol |: Today we drive to Dublin and Visit Down Cathedral where St Patrick's historical burial site is marked by a huge boulder. Immerse yourself in his work, life, and times in the nearby St Patrick Centre. Explore Crumlin Road Gaol and see what prison life was like through the ages. Then off to the Roman Forum, the biggest and most splendid of all, whose markets, true forerunners of the modern commercial centers, offered to the Roman citizen any goods to be found at that time. From here we visit the Colosseum, the everlasting symbol of the greatness of Rome and the stage for the historical fights of the gladiators. This engineering marvel could hold up to 80,000 spectators for gladiator battles and dramatic productions. Imperial Rome's iconic structure was built between 72 and 80 AD. After throwing coins into the Trevi Fountain to assure a return to Rome we walk to the Pantheon, one of the best preserved of all ancient Roman buildings. We end the day at Piazza Navona where we see the famous Fountain of the Four Rivers by Bernini. We return to the hotel for included dinner. (B, D)

Day 7: ASSISI • BASILICA OF SAN FRANCESCO • FLORENCE: We reach the charming and historic city of Assisi, perched atop a hill dominated by the Basilica of San Francesco (St. Francis). Our tour finds us in the heart of town where we see the Piazza del Commune and its medieval buildings. Departing Assisi our journey will take us through the cypress groves and vineyards of the Tuscany countryside towards Florence. We enjoy a two night stay in Florence. (B, D)

Day 8: FLORENCE walking Tour • PIAZZA DELLA SIGNORIA • SANTA MARIA DEL FIORE • The Academia Gallery: Today we discover why Florence is the cradle of the Renaissance with a local guide and marvel at the sights in this beautiful city, the capital of Tuscany and the birthplace of the Renaissance. Journey to the land of ancient treasures and Christian history as we walk in the footsteps of Paul. Filled with stunning scenery and adventurous explorations, you'll stand in the very places where the New Testament church began. From the iconic religious sites retracing the footsteps of the Apostle Paul to historic wonders like the Acropolis in Athens and a final touch of relaxation as you cruise on the Aegean. This is truly an inspirational journey you will never forget as you follow the path of the Apostle Paul on his missionary journeys.

Day 1 - Today we begin our journey with our overnight transatlantic flight. Get acquainted with fellow travelers and prepare for an awesome experience as we follow the Footsteps of Paul!

Day 2 - Arrive in Thessaloniki, Greece. We arrive in Thessaloniki where you will begin your sightseeing of Thessaloniki. This city, named after Alexander the Great's sister, and which figures prominently in the New Testament at which time this provincial capital was considered a world cultural center. This community was the center of Paul's activities in Northern Greece. It is where he preached and founded a church and to whom he wrote two epistles (Acts 17:1-9; 1 Thessalonians and 2 Thessalonians). You will also see the White Tower, the statue of Alexander the Great and the remains of the Palace complex of Galerius (Late 3rd century AD). The Arch of Glerus and Rotonda as well as the majestic City Walls and the Great Gate, which connected the city to the Via Egnatia - the transcontinental east-west road of the Roman Empire built in the 2nd century BC and used by Paul on his journeys (Acts 16). D

Day 3 - Thessalonika. Excursion to Philippi and Kavala: Full-day excursion along the ancient route of Apostle Paul to Amphipolis (Acts 17:1). Journey to ancient Philippi, which was named after the father of Alexander the Great. This busy Roman colony boasted a great library and theater. In Philippi, Paul preached, established the first church in Europe, and was to whom he wrote one of his epistles while imprisoned in Rome (Acts 16:11-40; Philippians). It was in this area that Paul met Lydia, a dealer in purple cloth. She and her household accepted Christ and were baptized in the nearby river (Acts 16:11-15). Next, continue to Kavala, ancient port of Neapolis, Greece's most picturesque mainland port where Paul arrived in this city with his coworkers Timothy and Silas. On the way back to Thessaloniki, you will pass through the ancient cities of **Amphipolis** and **Apollonia** (Acts 16:9-11). BD

Day 4 - Thessalonika-Veria-Kalambaka: This morning, stop in Veria (Berea of the New Testament), where Paul and Silas were sent by friends after being accused of treason in Thessalonika (Acts 17:5-15). Visit the Bema of St Paul, where is said to have stood and preached the Gospel to the local community. Continue to Kalambaka. Dinner and overnight. BD

Day 5 - Kalambaka–Meteora: In Meteora, visit the hanging monasteries situated atop vast rocks from the 14th century, one of the most breathtaking sites in the world. We will have an idea of the monastic life trying to be as far as possible from the human daily life and as near as possible to GOD. Inside the monasteries, discover many historical and religious treasures. Travel to Athens for overnight.BD











Day 6 - Corinth-Athens: After breakfast we will have a short drive to Corinth to visit the archaeological site where Apostle Paul worked for 18 months with tent makers Aquila and Priscilla (Acts 18:1-18). We will learn about this ancient city –state and its early church community which was the recipient of Paul's two Corinthians epistles. We will pass by the old ports St. Paul had stopped, Lachion and Cenchreae. We will see also the handmade Corinth Canal connecting the Aegean with the Ionian Seas. Overnight Athens. BD

Day 7 - Athens–Piraeus (Embarkation)–Mykonos: We transfer to the port of Piraeus to begin our 4-night Greece and Turkey cruise with a visit to the mountainous island of Mykonos. Free time to explore the island before returning to the ship for evening entertainment. BLD

Day 8 - Kusadasi, Turkey–Patmos, Greece: Visit the Turkish port of Kusadasi, and enjoy an included excursion to Ancient Ephesus, whose inhabitants were the recipients of Apostle Paul's famous epistle (Acts 18:19-26; Ephesians) and which was once the capital of the Roman province of Asia, and to the House of Mary, where the Virgin Mary is said to have spent her last days. Continue your cruise to Patmos, with free time to discover the "Jerusalem of the Aegean". We visit the Monastery of St. John and to the Cave of the Apocalypse, where John the Evangelist wrote the Book of the Revelation during his exile (Rev. 1:9-11). BLD

Day 9 - Rhodes: Today we will spend the whole day in the unique island of Rhodes. Your shore excursion includes a visit to Lindos and the Acropolis of 400 m height of the sea to view St Paul Bay where he had stopped on his way back to Palestine (Acts 21: 1) for his trial and imprisonment. Then return to the old city of Rhodes where you will go through D'Amboise Gate to walk on the Street of the Knights. Along this street you will find the residences of the Knights city inside the walls to explore! Then back to the ship for dinner and evening entertainment. BLD

Day 10 - Crete-Santorini: This morning we arrive in Heraklion. The capital of Crete is a former Venetian harbor with representative architecture and art. Our included tour of the city takes us on a short drive to the Minoan Palace of Knossos, home to Europe's oldest civilization. Then we return for a visit to Heraklio where the church of St Titus, one of the followers of St Paul. This afternoon we continue our cruise to Santorini, one of the most renowned places of the world. People travel thousands of miles in order to admire its unique geography, a result of an earthquake that took place many centuries ago. We can take the shore excursion to Oia Village and Fira (the capital) or we just have free time to explore the unique capital on the Caldera over the volcanic hill which is accessible either by foot, donkey ride or by the cable car. BLD

Day 11 - Piraeus, Greece (Disembarkation)— Athens: We will disembark the cruise today to spend the day in Athens where we will visit the Acropolis, Parthenon, Areopagus, and Mars Hill where the Apostle Paul delivered his well-known sermon. (Acts 17:15-34).
