We are continuing to update our policies but sometimes as soon as we update they are out dated.

Registration deadlines and deposit due dates will be strictly followed. It's very important travelers understand the necessity of registering early and committing to a tour to ensure the success of a guaranteed departure. Koinonia requires 30 registered travelers with deposits paid to guarantee a domestic motor-coach tour. Koinonia requires 20 registered with deposits paid for an international tour. We do offer guaranteed departures for some of our international tours planned with our partner tour operators. Reminder: Deposits are required early and it's important you understand the policies, especially with our international tours. Space for tours fills quickly with international tours and they are very strict with policies and payment schedules. Travel Protection Insurance is available for every tour.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: GENERAL GUIDELINES, RESERVATION POLICIES, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

(Please read carefully before signing up for a tour, your reservation constitutes acceptance of our policies.)

Koinonia Travels and Tours purpose is to strive to create unique, carefree, extraordinary travel experiences with lasting memories for individuals and groups while offering unsurpassed value and exceptional quality with personalized service. We desire to be the best travel professionals and providers in the travel industry. The following policies and guidelines are designed to help us accomplish our purpose.

Responsibilities: All tours are arranged and operated by Koinonia Travels and Tours (KTT) (LLC). KTT acts only as your agent in arranging and sponsoring the various accommodations that are made available, and assumes no responsibility nor liability in connection with the services rendered by any vessel, carriage or other conveyance, excursions, sightseeing events, restaurants, hotels or motels or any other accommodation, event or equipment used in the performance of the tour. KTT assumes no responsibility for any delay, accident, failure or sickness incurred while using any leased services.

KTT reserves the right to make changes in the itinerary or tour arrangements at any time, due to emergency or otherwise unknown situations. If KTT cancels a tour, it shall have no responsibility to participants beyond the refund of the monies paid to KTT by the participants. In case of events beyond our control, including but not limited to strikes, lockouts, revolts, wars, natural disasters, fires, closures of airports or hotels, or technical problems of transport, which force us to cancel the tour you have booked, you will be entitled to a full refund minus reasonable expenses for services performed. In any of the above cases, KTT shall not be under any other obligation of liability to participants. KTT reserves the right to alter the itinerary or arrangements deemed necessary without penalty. Time restraints including traffic and weather or mechanical failure of equipment beyond our control shall be deemed conditions for change. KTT shall be under no liability because of cancellation of any event, show, game or activity that is cancelled due to weather or any other condition beyond KTT's control. KTT reserves the right to make any corrections deemed necessary to any printed or electronic distributed materials. We reserve the right to accept or decline any person as a member of any tour at any time.

Reservations:

How far in advance do I need to make a reservation? We suggest reservations be made as soon as your vacation schedule is known. Many people wait too long and are disappointed that the date they want has been sold out. Most festival tours have only limited departures and are sold out long in advance. We feel that you do yourself and KTT an immense favor by making your reservations as soon as possible. **How do I make a reservation?** 1) Select the KTT tour of your choice and the date that is most convenient for you. 2) Call our local number and confirm your reservation. 3) Complete the reservation form available on-line or we can mail or fax you a form. Mail completed reservation form along with your deposit check, made payable to KTT within 10 days of making your reservation. Your seat will be confirmed and guaranteed once we receive your deposit and reservation form. KTT will guarantee a departure once the required numbers are registered for a tour.

Required Deposits – Final Payments:

Deposits are due within 10 days after making your reservation. Names will be removed from the trip roster if deposit is not received. **Separate checks should be sent for each tour booked.** Tours priced from \$0—\$1500..... \$250 Deposit Tours priced over \$1500..... \$500 Deposit

Tours that include a cruise or airfare may have different deposit requirements. Many are requiring non-refundable deposits.

Final payment for all motor coach tours is due no later than 45 days prior to departure. Please mark your calendar with the due date. Individuals who register for a tour with less than 45 days prior to departure must pay full amount when registering. No refunds with cancellation 45 days or less from departure. **Final payments** on all tours involving air travel and cruise lines are due 90 days from departure unless otherwise notified. Please be aware that Cruise Lines', Airlines' and Travel Vendors' cancellation policies, deposits, refunds vary and we must follow each one's policies. **Cancellation Policy: Special Note: Vendors Policy will take priority over Koinonia Policies when making reservations for both international and domestic tours. Group policies with vendors in the travel industry, such as transportation, lodging, restaurants and attractions are constantly changing.**

We at KTT understand that at times, due to uncontrollable circumstances, it may become necessary for you to cancel a tour. In the event that cancellation does become necessary, the following policy will apply: KTT will have to charge any non-recoverable expenditures made on behalf of the participant at the time of cancellation. These costs would be for tickets, meals, hotels, airline, cruises, etc. Many vendors such as airline companies, cruise lines, motor-coach, hotels, restaurants, and theaters require non-refundable deposits and payments in advance. Many times these monies are totally non-recoverable. In addition to any non-recoverable expenditure, there will be a \$30 handling fee withheld on all cancellations regardless of the reason to cover the cost of postage, processing, faxes, administrative and telephone expenses. Motor-coach Tour Cancellations made 45-days or less prior to tour departure will be subject to the entire cost of the tour. International Tour Cancellations made 100 days or less prior to departure will be subject to entire cost of tour. Once the tour departs, no refunds will be made. Refunds are not given for any meals or attractions in which the traveler does not participate while on tour. Koinonia reserves the right to cancel any tour for conditions beyond our control including insufficient participation. Travel Insurance recommended!

Final Tour Information: Once final payment has been made for tours you will receive travel documents with final tour information in the mail or via email no later than two weeks before departure. Name tags, luggage tags and other necessary information will be handed out on the first day of tour unless it is an international tour. Most international tours will have a final briefing meeting to distribute the documents or they will be mailed to you.

Each tour's Itinerary will list the inclusions for that tour including meals, admissions, transportation, guides, sightseeing, accommodations and gratuities.

Personal Expenses are the responsibility of the passenger. This also includes expenses incurred due to flight cancellations or delays, technical faults, weather conditions, political closures, local events, traffic conditions, etc.

Tobacco Products, Alcohol or Firearms are not allowed on Motor-Coaches. This is due to State and Federal Law! NO EXCEPTIONS!

Seat Rotation: This assures equal opportunity for each tour member to view scenery from different locations on coach and to fellowship with all travelers.

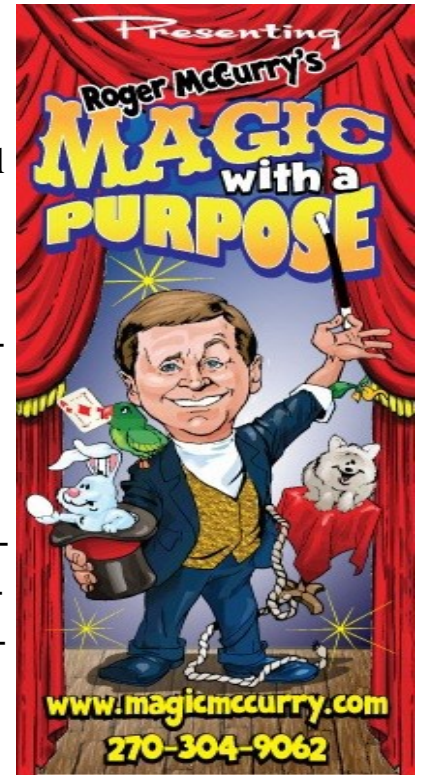

8. Thou shall learn to listen to instructions, be on time and follow the schedule!
9. Thou are welcome in every city, treat thy people with respect, and thou shall be an honored guest!
10. Thou shall remember no one can ruin your day without your permission!

Travel Insurance:

What is it? Do I need it? What does it cover? How much does it cost? When should I buy it? I hear these questions often from our travelers. Travelers are thinking more about travel insurance because of the amount of investment and the uncertainties in life. You've registered for a trip, you're excited about traveling but you understand whether you are at home or traveling, life happens-which can affect your travel plans! You want to protect your investment.

Travel insurance becomes a safety net and without it traveling is a bit of a gamble: Can you afford to lose your investment in the trip or pay for medical cost? It's becoming necessary for all international travel and more travelers are interested in protecting their investment while traveling in the United States. Whether you are at home or on vacation, life happens – and that can affect your travel plans. You or your child may get sick and you have to cancel your trip. The airlines may lose your luggage. You may miss your flight connection and lose days in your destination. You could have an accident, get sick and need medical attention – from physicians who don't speak English. A good travel insurance plan provides coverage for all of these situations and more – any time you go 100+ miles from home. I've personally seen it get very costly for travelers without insurance! I've also seen where travelers were taken very good care of because they had coverage. It offers peace of mind!

There are many different types of coverage available. Please review a plan's Description of Coverage before you buy – or call the company to speak with a representative about your specific situation. I will provide a number where you can talk to an expert and ask all your questions. Important!!!!!! Most companies require you to purchase insurance within two weeks of your deposit to have the pre-existing conditions waived!!!!

Types of Coverage: While specific policies may vary, travel insurance generally covers:

- Trip Cancellation, with the possible option to upgrade to Cancel For Any Reason
- Trip Interruption, Trip Delay, and Missed Connection
- Baggage Protection
- Emergency Accident and Sickness
- Evacuation and Repatriation of Mortal Remains
- Hazardous Sports Coverage
- Accidental Death and Dismemberment



KOINONIA TRAVELERS:

Anytime you buy insurance, you should understand its coverages and limitations *before* you buy!!!!

I suggest travel insurance for all my trips! I work with a couple different companies I believe offer good plans at a reasonable rate and have a very good reputation in the industry. They also allow me to use the trip confirmation date as the deposit date. That 's the date I announce we have the numbers and the trip is a definite go! Most companies have a pre-existing condition wavier if you purchase your insurance within a certain time frame after making a trip deposit, usually 7-14 days. The pre-existing condition waiver can be a valuable benefit for travelers with pre-existing conditions.

I can also request individual quotes for travelers. Cost is based on the age of the traveler, cost of the trip and the duration of the trip. Once you decide to purchased insurance you can contact me with your date of birth, contact information and I will request a quote and it will be sent to you via email or phone call.

Please, I encourage to look around and compare companies, you may share my name as your travel provider. You may visit my website and click on the travel insurance icon and request a quote. You just provide them with trip information and they will email you the quote and you can purchase online.

Remember: Ask your questions and make sure you understand all the guidelines and benefits of Travel Protection Insurance!

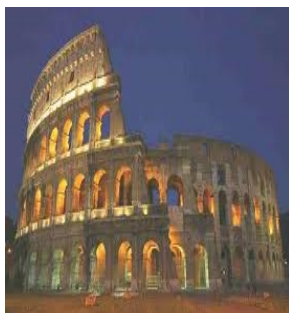

Northern Michigan: Holland Tulip Festival, Gilmore Car Museum, Charlevoix, Mackinac Island, Frankenmuth: Henry Ford Museum!

May 4th -10th, 2026



The State of Michigan is blessed with the riches of unspoiled nature: the nation's longest freshwater coastline, lakes that feel like oceans, golden beaches, and glorious sunrises and sunsets. Michigan is a unique, two-peninsula US state in the Great Lakes region. Michigan is known as the "Great Lakes State" for its vast freshwater coastline, the "Mitten State" for its Lower Peninsula's shape, and "Motor City" (Detroit) for its automotive history. It offers abundant natural beauty, diverse cities, and a blend of industrial heritage. It features dense forests, extensive lakes, agriculture, and is defined by its two distinct peninsulas (Upper and Lower) separated by the Straits of Mackinac.

Day 1: Board your deluxe motor-coach and begin your wonderful journey to Northern Michigan. Get acquainted with fellow travelers as we make our way north across the rolling hills of Kentucky into Indiana and then into Michigan. This afternoon we visit the 90 acre campus of the **Gilmore Car Museum**. The America's Signature Collection includes an old fashioned gas station, a 1930 Rolls Royce, a 57 Chevy, over 300 vintage automobiles plus motorcycles. Then it's off to Grand Rapids.

Day 2: Holland Tulip Festival: Tulip Time celebrates tulips, Dutch heritage, and the Holland, Michigan community. Throughout the last 95 years, millions of people have gathered to enjoy Tulip Time in Holland, Michigan. Enjoy over six million tulips blooming throughout the city and area attractions. Tulip Time has been heralded as the nation's Best Flower Festival and America's Best Small Town Festival plus awarded Tulip Festival of the Year! We will embrace the heritage, celebrate the diverse community, and fawn over one of nature's most beautiful and varied flowers: the beloved tulip. **Windmill Island Gardens:** A beautiful oasis, featuring 36 acres of manicured gardens, over 150,000 tulips, dikes, canals, walking paths. The centerpiece is an authentic, working Dutch windmill, "De Zwaan". There is also an antique children's carousel, Amsterdam street organ, and "Story of DeZwaan" movie offering additional cultural history. **Veldheer's Tulip Gardens & DeKlomp Wooden Shoe & Delft Factory:** With over 4 million tulips, it's a great opportunity to see fields of beautiful flowers. At the Wooden Shoe and Delft Factory, you can talk with the artists as they hand carve your very own wooden shoes or hand paint blue and white delftware.

Day 3: This morning we visit the **Frederik Meijer Gardens**. The Lena Meijer Tropical Conservatory is a five-story, 15,000 square-foot facility featuring rock landscapes, a waterfall, and a variety of exotic plant selections. The Frederik Meijer Gardens & Sculpture Park contains a host of colossal masterworks including "The American Horse" by Nina Akamu. The Taste of the Gardens Café includes a glass ceiling sculpture by renowned artist Dale Chihuly. We depart Grand Rapids traveling to upper Michigan and the picturesque city of Charlevoix. Our local guide will show us the architectural diversity of this lovely city. Highlighted are more than 30 homes designed by local architect, Earl Young. Dating from 1921 to the 1950's, these unique, "mushroom houses" are built out of native stone and sport cedar shake roofs.

Day 4: Mackinac Island: This morning we board a ferry for an 18-minute cruise across the Straits of Mackinac to fascinating Mackinac Island. Mackinac Island has no motorized vehicles, and the only way to get around is by horse-drawn carriage, bicycle or foot. This morning we are off for a horse-drawn carriage tour of Mackinac Island and the State Park. We see several of the many rock formations along the shore from our carriage. The famous Grand Luncheon Buffet is included today at the beautiful Grand Hotel. Free-Time: Enjoy the sweeping view of the Straits & The Mighty Mac Bridge, stroll the shops of Huron Street, or walk some of the endless nature trails on the island. You may wish to see the Old Fort, which is within walking distance of the downtown area, or shop in the many shops. Don't forget to try the famous Mackinac Fudge.

Day 5: Frankenmuth • Bronner's Christmas Wonderland • Bavarian Village. Our next stop today is in Frankenmuth, a Bavarian village founded in 1845 by Franconia's from Germany. Enjoy the 35-bell glockenspiel that tells the story of the Pied Piper, then explore a nostalgic world of gift shops, craft shops, restaurants, and bakeries along Main Street. Learn about the history and German influence with a local guide. Before leaving, we visit Bronner's Christmas Wonderland, the largest and best known Christmas decoration store in the world. We enjoy a meal at one of the world-famous family-style chicken dinner restaurants.



Day 6: Henry Ford Museum. This morning we enjoy the Henry Ford Museum. We see nearly three hundred years of technological and cultural change. The museum's collections include communications, transportation, agriculture and domestic life. We will discover why this is the city that put the world on wheels. See more than 12 acres of exhibits and collections that reflect America's major developments in agriculture, steam power, communications, lighting, and transportation. Dozens of classic and antique cars, trains and buggies fill the building. Plus, you can enjoy a walk outside in a city of the past. Greenfield Village: Sprawling open-air history museum founded by Henry Ford with artifacts & homes of famous Americans. Experience firsthand the sights, sounds and sensations of America's fascinating formation, where over 80 acres brim with resourcefulness and ingenuity. Here, 300 years of American perseverance serve as a living reminder that anything is possible. Step foot in the lab where Thomas Edison had his lightbulb moment or the workshop where the Wright brothers taught us to reach for the sky. Take a ride in a real Model T, or walk through four working farms. Rub shoulders with world-class artisans, and explore the place where America's can-do spirit inspires you to go out and get it done.



Day 7: It is hard to believe our tour has come to an end! This has been a very scenic fun-filled adventure! Enjoy your last day with your new friends and reminiscing about all the precious memories you created on this tour.

Vancouver, with its dramatic location between the Rocky Mountains and the Pacific Ocean, is sure to inspire you. Flight to Vancouver. Flights can be booked individual or as a group with Koinonia. Group Transfer to hotel for a 3 night stay. We'll have time to get acquainted with travelers as we enjoy fellowship, "KOINONIA".



Day 2: VANCOUVER • HARBOR CENTER OBSERVATION DECK • STANLEY PARK: This morning we explore Vancouver, British Columbia. We'll visit the downtown core with possibly a stop at the Harbor Center observation deck which offers spectacular views of the city and surrounding areas. We experience the splendor of Vancouver with a sightseeing tour that includes beautiful Stanley Park, an urban rainforest that juts out into the sea. We will learn about its history and culture from our guide as we explore the city and surrounding area. We also visit the waterfront area and Chinatown, one of North America's largest. Here, quaint shops display jade, ivory, silk, bamboo, brocade and food items.

Day 3: VICTORIA SIGHTSEEING • BUTCHART GARDENS: We depart early this morning for the BC ferry for the journey across the Strait of Georgia to Vancouver Island and British Columbia's capital city of Victoria. We explore the city of Victoria, the "City of Gardens." We enjoy a sightseeing tour of picturesque Victoria which still maintains a delightful English flavor. See Tudor-style buildings, red double decker buses, immaculate gardens, Parliament Buildings, British Provincial Museum, Beacon Hill Park and Christ Church Cathedral. This afternoon we visit beautiful Butchart Gardens which features a variety of lovely floral displays. Here we discover world famous ornate landscaping and superb Italian, and Japanese gardens along with water falls, fountains and rose gardens. We'll be amazed at all the colorful flowers, plants and trees with amazing landscaping. Later this afternoon we board the ferry back to Vancouver.



Day 4: CAPILANO SUSPENSION BRIDGE • WHISTLER • KAMLOOPS: A spectacular day of sightseeing awaits us today as we leave Vancouver. This morning we visit the incredible Capilano Suspension Bridge for a breathtaking view of west coast nature at its best. We make our way through some incredible scenery on our way to the ski resort village of Whistler where we have time to sightsee and enjoy lunch. This afternoon it's more beautiful scenery as we travel to Kamloops for the evening.



Day 5: JASPER: Leaving Kamloops our route takes us through the fertile Fraser Valley. We are surrounded by dramatic scenery as we follow the North Thompson River through the Monashee and Cariboo Mountains. We view Mount Robson, the highest peak in the Canadian Rockies at 3,954 meters (12,972 feet), and through the Yellowhead Pass into Jasper National Park. Then it is onto Jasper for our overnight accommodations.



Day 6: Maligne Lake Cruise: Today, in spite of its highways and railroad, Jasper National Park looks very much like it did when David Thompson, Canada's great fur-trader-era explorer, first saw it. Enjoy the breathtaking scenery and unparalleled vistas of Jasper National Park on a Maligne Lake Cruise. Learn the local history, geology, wild-life and glaciology of the lake and park as some of the most spectacular scenery in the Rockies drifts past your window. Watch moose lazily wander the shoreline and look for other wildlife native to the area. We return to Jasper and ride the Sky Tram up Whistlers Mountain to an elevation of 2,263

metres, showing us stunning vistas over mountain ranges stretching up to 80 kilometres away. On a clear day, you can even see the white pyramid of Mount Robson in nearby British Columbia. Afternoon enjoy free time to explore the town on your own.

Day 7: ATHABASCA FALLS • COLUMBIA ICEFIELDS SNOW

COACH • LAKE LOUISE • BANFF GONDOLA: This morning we travel along the Icefields Parkway, one of the most spectacular drives in the world. You will marvel at the towering snowcapped peaks, azure lakes, thundering waterfalls, and hanging glaciers. You may even spot wildlife. We'll visit Athabasca Falls, one of the most powerful and breathtaking falls in the Rocky Mountains. At the Columbia Icefield, we board a Snow Coach Ice Explorer for a ride on the enormous Athabasca Glacier. We ride a special designed vehicle to the middle of the glacier as your driver points out interesting geological



features. At the icefall below the glacier headwall, you will step out onto ice formed from snow which fell as long as 400-500 years ago. Take a walk on the incredible Glacier Skywalk, a glass-floored observation deck perched 918 feet above spectacular glacier-formed valleys and rushing waterfalls. Our next stop is Lake Louise, one of the most photographed spots in the world. Hopefully we arrive in Banff early enough to have time to explore the city and some may want to take the Sulphur Mountain Gondola Lift to the top of the mountain for majestic views.



Day 8: BANFF To KALISPELL: Our route today takes us along highway 93, the north-south route through British Columbia to the US Border. We travel through the Vermilion Pass and Kootenay National Park, passing Radium Hot Springs, Invermere, Windermere and Fairmont Hot Springs. Windermere Lake, Columbia Lake, and the Kootenay River, border us as we travel this beautiful scenic highway. Late this afternoon we arrive in Kalispell for a two night stay.

Day 9: GLACIER NATIONAL PARK • "GOING-TO-THE-SUN": This morning you may take your time to enjoy the beautiful surroundings. Today we explore Glacier National Park which preserves over one million acres of forests, alpine meadows and lakes, and is home to over 70 species of mammals and 270 species of birds. We board one of the famous Jammer cars for the "Going-to-the-Sun" Road to the top of the Continental Divide at Logan Pass. After our tour we return to Kalispell for dinner and overnight.



Day 10: Flight Home: After Breakfast we transfer to the airport for our flight home with precious memories of a fantastic Canadian Rockies Adventure! Take some time to remember all the wonderful things you experienced while traveling on this fantastic adventure. You will have time on you flight to think about your next adventure with Koinonia.

Canyons, Mesas and National Parks of the Southwest

Sedona, Grand Canyon, Lake Powell, Zion, Bryce, Arches, Antelope, Mesa Verde, Monument Valley, Durango, Silverton, Taos, Santa Fe, Albuquerque

September 13 - 23, 2026



This journey will be an amazing tour as you experience beautiful mountain vistas, deserts, delicate stone arches, beautiful multi-colored canyons, towering stone monoliths, crystal-clear lakes, fascinating river bends, colorful red buttes and spires, weird looking hoodoos, ancient villages, sacred grounds and one-of-a-kind relics and artifacts. You will experience history, museums, ruins, culture, fun, food, fellowship, entertainment, excitement, amazement, neon lights, relaxation and more.

Day 1: Travel Day, Flight to Phoenix, Arizona: Today we fly to the capitol of Arizona. Our motor-coach will meet us and we will board the coach to travel Sedona, AZ. As we approach this beautiful town, you will discover why it's known worldwide for the beauty of the red rocks. We can easily see why it's one of Hollywood's favorite movie locations. We'll enjoy a brief visit to this artist known community. Overnight Sedona.



Day 2: Leaving Sedona, we travel north, quickly ascending the 2,000 foot gorge of Oak Creek Canyon. We continue to the South Rim of **Grand Canyon National Park** and are awed by its vastness and the Colorado River winding almost a mile below. We stop at the South Rim Visitors Center and see spectacular views at Mather Point. Today will be a long-remembered highlight of our tour. There's no way to prepare for what we see as endless oceans of colors spread to the far horizons in ever-changing waves of gold, crimson, blue and lavender sandstone. Incised by the Colorado River, the canyon is immense, averaging 4,000 feet deep for its entire 277 miles. It is 6,000 feet deep at its deepest point and 18 miles at its widest. Located on the ancestral homelands of 11 present day Tribal Communities, Grand Canyon is one of the most spectacular examples of erosion anywhere in the world. We drive the South Rim Road with amazing views. Our last Viewpoint will be the Desert View Watch Tower before leaving the park.

Day 3: Today we explore Page, home of the Glen Canyon Dam on the Colorado River and the Glen Powell National Recreation Area. We'll see the massive Glen Canyon Dam and take a tranquil sightseeing boat cruise on sky-blue Lake Powell through Glen Canyon. We will learn how Lake Powell was formed by harnessing the Colorado River at the Glen Canyon Dam. This 196 mile long dazzling blue oasis in the middle of a desert is spectacular! Anyone up for a hike to the iconic and majestic viewpoint at Horseshoe Bend. This leisurely 0.6 mile hike leads to one of the most spectacular views of the Colorado River as it meanders through the colorful rock.

Day 4: We visit the incredible Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park, where numerous Western movies, television shows and commercials have been filmed. **Monument Valley** (*Navajo: Tsé Bii' Ndzisgaii*), meaning *valley of the rocks*. The valley is considered sacred by the Navajo Nation. Experience the park with a Navajo guide while riding a custom built four-wheel drive jeep. A traditional Navajo lunch in the valley will be an experience not soon forgotten. Monument Valley is not a valley at all, but rather a wide, flat landscape interrupted by colorful red buttes and spires rising hundreds of feet into the air. These are the last remnants of the sedimentary rock layers that once covered the entire region. Monument Valley is contained entirely within the Navajo reservation, occupying both Utah and Arizona. This is one of the most remarkable, beautiful and famous landscapes in the world. Then it's off to explore a **slot canyon**. A slot canyon is a long, narrow gorge/channel or drainage way with sheer rock walls that are typically eroded into either sandstone or other sedimentary rock. They are named for their narrow width, often squeezing down to a sliver. Utah is famous for its amazing slot canyons and has the largest concentration of slot canyons in the world. Hopefully we can explore **Antelope Canyon**, the most photographed slot canyon in Northern Arizona. It's located in the Navajo Nation: The Navajo call it Tsé bighánílní, which means, "the place where water runs through rocks."



Day 5: Zion NP & Bryce NP: This morning, we board our deluxe motor-coach and depart for Zion National Park, where the Virgin River has cut a dramatic rugged gorge through multi-hued sandstone, shale and limestone. Admire the towering rock walls surrounding us while riding through the park. Desert terrain and huge, sculpted rock formations coexist with waterfalls and hanging gardens in this spectacular gorge carved through strangely colored sandstone, shale and limestone. We'll follow scenic Mt. Carmel Highway through the One Mile Tunnel. The Mormons called this spectacular outdoor wonderland the "Heavenly City of God," because its massive formations of extremely vertical rock looked like huge cathedrals and thrones. Lake West Temple rises to 7,795 feet. Driving through the park road, we are surrounded by the narrow, steep walls of side canyons, which

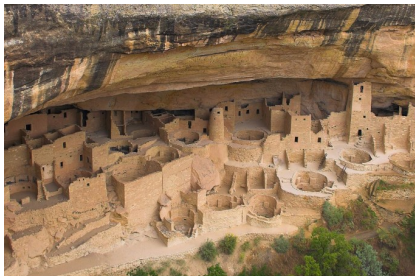
branch out in all directions from the main gorge, showcasing a constant changing of colors. After seeing one of the park's more noted landmarks, the Temple of Sinawava, a natural amphitheater surrounded by pink cliffs. Our drive takes us through the Dixie National Forest where Bryce Canyon National Park is located. Though it's much smaller than Zion, Bryce has its own brand of unique beauty, featuring weird-looking formations known as hoodoos. These formations undergo a constant change of color from the reflection of sunlight hitting at different angles. From the rim drive, the oddly shaped rocks and cliffs resemble castles, animals, people, and houses.



Day 5: Our route today takes us along Highway 12, one of Utah's most beautiful scenic byways. **The Grand Staircase Escalante** is a series of great geological steps of alternating cliffs, slopes and terraces ascending more than 6,000-feet. This masterpiece of geological and biological diversity, designated a National Monument in 1996, was one of the last mapped areas of the continental US. We'll continue through the towering Ponderosa Pines in the Dixie National Forest. We drive through the San Rafael Desert to **Capitol Reef National Park**. Here we see narrow canyons, ridges, arches, spires and domes. The monument is so named because of the resemblance of the many whitish sandstone domes to the US Capitol building; the "Reef" refers to the high uplifted ridge running north-south along the fold which presented a considerable barrier to early settlers. We will view the ancient petroglyphs in Capitol Reef National Park.



Day 6: Today we visit one of the jewels of the southwest, **Arches National Park**, a rugged area containing the largest number of natural stone arches in the world. The arches were formed by the weathering of openings in vertical slabs of sandstone. This timeless, natural landscape of giant stone arches, pinnacles, spires, fins and windows, once the bed of an ancient sea. The power of erosion has laid bare the skeletal structure of the earth in Arches National Park. We witness breathtaking views divided by massive canyons of the Green and Colorado Rivers as we make a brief visit to Dead Horse Point State Park. Enjoy the beautiful surroundings of "Canyonlands National Park" and learn about the legend of the name "Dead Horse Point". According to one legend, around the turn of the century, the point was used as a corral for wild mustangs roaming the mesa top. Cowboys rounded up horses, herded them across the narrow neck of land and onto the point. The neck, which is only 30-yards-wide, was then fenced off with branches and brush. It's an amazing view of the valley and Colorado River.



Day 7: Today we visit **Mesa Verde National Park**. This will be another highlight of the tour. Mesa Verde, Spanish for "Green Table". It's a large plateau towering 2,000 feet above the surrounding valleys and is famous for the well-preserved, pre-Columbian cliff dwellings in the shallow alcoves of its many canyon walls. Nearly 5,000 archeological sites built by the Ancestral Pueblo People from A.D. 600 to 1300. We will explore some of the UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITES as we take this scenic drive and discover the many dwellings. Next we drive to Durango, Co. Tucked into the stunning landscape of Southwestern Colorado, Durango is a destination where history, culture and outdoor adventure converge. Durango's rich heritage is well-preserved in the Main Avenue Historic District, where Victorian-era buildings echo Durango's mining-town past. We will enjoy this unique western town.

Day 8: Travel back in time today aboard the iconic Durango and Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad for a thrilling ride that captures the spirit of the Old West. This historic 1880s steam engine chugs through Colorado's San Juan Mountains while offering incredible panoramic views along the Animas River. The line was constructed to haul silver & gold ore from Southwest Colorado's San Juan Mountains, but passengers soon realized it was the view that was truly precious. This historic train has been in continuous operation between Durango and Silverton since 1882. The train will stop in Silverton and you will have some time to explore this old Silver Mining Town before you return to Durango on the train. Wow, What a adventure!



Day 9: Today we travel to the "Land of Enchantment" New Mexico. Our destination: Taos, New Mexico, is a unique high-desert town known for its stunning landscapes, rich Native American and Spanish cultures, thriving art scene, and outdoor adventures, offering a laid-back vibe with a spiritual, artistic, and sometimes unconventional atmosphere, set against the Sangre de Cristo Mountains and Rio Grande Gorge, **The Taos Pueblo is the only living Native American community designated both a World Heritage Site by UNESCO and a National Historic Landmark**. Today we explore Taos.



Day 10: Today we visit Sante Fe, New Mexico: a historic and culturally rich city known as the oldest state capital in the U.S., blending Native American, Spanish, Mexican, and Anglo influences, famous for its distinctive adobe architecture, vibrant arts scene (including the Georgia O'Keeffe Museum), unique cuisine featuring New Mexican chile, stunning Sangre de Cristo mountain scenery, and as a UNESCO Creative City. It has a deep history, with historic sites like the Santa Fe Plaza and Palace of Governors. In the heart of historic Santa Fe, New Mexico, **The Loretto Chapel** attracts people from all over the world who want to find out more about the revered *miraculous staircase*. Three mysteries surround the spiral staircase in the Loretto Chapel: the identity of its builder, the type of wood used, and the physics of its construction. We have a connection, the sisters of Loretto Chapel are originally from Kentucky. This afternoon we travel to Albuquerque and hopefully have time to take the Sandia Peak Tramway and visit "Old Town".

Day 11: Our wonderful, exciting Canyons, Mesas and National Parks tour comes to an end as we are transferred to the airport for our flight home! So many exciting memories and new friends to remember.

It's known for its historic buildings, waterfront views, and vibrant food scene. Halifax is also home to the Halifax Citadel National Historic Site, one of the most visited national historic sites in Canada. We visit the famous Citadel, surrounded by a dry moat, as well as the Old Town Clock, Point Pleasant Park, and the Public Gardens. We learn interesting facts and the history of the city with a local guide. Leaving Halifax, we head north through still more scenic countryside to Baddeck. Baddeck has been described as the beginning – and the end – of Cape Breton Island's world-famous Cabot Trail. Nestled along the shore of the Bras d'Or Lake in Cape Breton, the town is a favorite stop for sailors and those looking for tranquil beauty in the heart of the island. We spend two nights in Baddeck, Nova Scotia.





Day 5: CABOT TRAIL • LUNCH AT KELTIC LODGE:

Today we travel the Cabot Trail, often described as the most spectacular drive in North America. Take a deep breath---the scenery is unsurpassed! See awesome views from windswept peaks, infinite steeps of saw tooth rock, lonely beaches, and heart-stopping drops down sheer cliff-sides. We pass small fishing villages along the Gulf of St. Lawrence to the Cape Breton Highlands National Park. We climb sharply over 1,116 feet, taking in the magnificent views of the Gulf, then travel east along the plateau overlooking the Atlantic. The shore is rocky, identified with numerous coves at the mouths of picturesque valleys. A memorable lunch is included today at

Keltic Lodge. After lunch we pass through the fishing villages of Cheticamp, St. Joseph du Moine, and Grand Etang. Here the people live as their Norman ancestors lived, speaking French and producing desirable handicrafts. We visit the Alexander Graham Bell Museum upon returning to Baddeck for the night.

Day 6: PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND • LOBSTER SUPPER: Today we drive to Caribou and board the ferry to Prince Edward Island's eastern shore. On the island, we follow the King's Byway through potato fields and farming areas enroute to the capital city of Charlottetown. Tonight promises to be an evening you'll long remember as we travel to the picturesque village of New Glasgow, nestled along the scenic Clyde River, where we'll enjoy a lobster feast the island way!

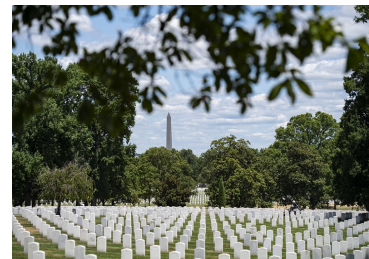
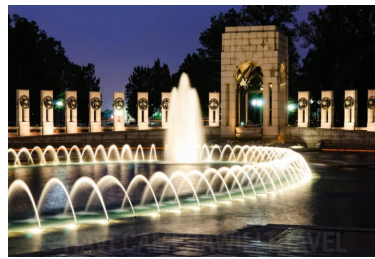

The 5,000-acre plantation features gardens, orchards, a vineyard, and fields for crops like tobacco and wheat.: An industrial hub with workshops (nailery, carpentry, blacksmith) and quarters for enslaved workers. The plantation was aimed to be self-sustaining, with specialized labor and diverse production.

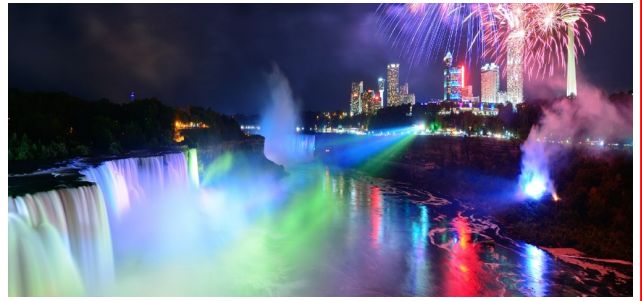

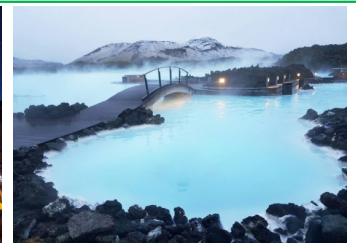

We’ll see the Roman Amphitheatre, hippodrome, a film on the history and remains of this famous port city and aqueduct. Then we journey to Mt. Carmel, where Elijah challenged King Ahab and the prophets of Baal. Next, we travel through the Jezreel Valley to Megiddo, the Armageddon Battlefield, where archaeologists have unearthed 20 levels of civilization. We drive through the area of Cana and Nazareth, the boyhood home of Jesus, where we visit the Nazareth Village - a wonderful recreation of Biblical times with costumed guides. **Day 8: Jordan River Baptism Sites, Beth Shean/Scythopolis, Bethany Beyond the Jordan, Jericho, Wadi Qelt, Jerusalem.** **Day 9: Western Wall Tunnels, St. Anne – Israel Museum – Bethlehem – Shepherd’s Field.** **Day 10: Masada, Ein Gedi, Qumran Caves, Dead Sea Scrolls, Abraham’s Tent.** **Day 11: Jerusalem, Davidson Center, Southern Wall Excavations, Upper Room, Zion Gate, House of Caiaphas, Yad Vashem Holocaust.** **Day 12: Mt of Olives, Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus’ Steps, The Last Days:** Temple era. Judgment Hall of Pilate, hear of those who conspired against Him and are reminded of His brutal beating and humiliation. We will see the Pool of Bethesda, Stephen’s Gate and St. Ann’s Church. Later today we walk where Jesus walked; beginning our route with a panoramic view of the city, Mount Moriah and the Dome of the Rock from atop the Mount of Olives and then the Garden of Gethsemane. Old City. While walking along the Via Dolorosa, we are reminded of His way of suffering along with a visit to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. Our guide will explain the differing opinions on the route that Christ was led. Our climax of the day is the area of Golgotha (place of the skull) and the Garden Tomb, where we celebrate the resurrection with communion and a time of praise. **Farewell Dinner and Fellowship.** **Day 13: Home!**

Iceland is a country known for its natural wonders: glaciers, active volcanoes, black-sand beaches, geothermal areas, roaring rivers, hot springs, mud pools, scenic coastline, majestic waterfalls, and beautiful lakes. On this Iceland tour, you will witness these natural wonders while enjoying fun and unique experiences. Scenic highlights include mighty Gullfoss waterfall, and Goðafoss, known as the "Waterfall of the Gods." Take pictures at Dettifoss, the most powerful waterfall in Europe. Drive by Eyjafjallajökull Volcano, well known for the eruption that generated the massive ash cloud in 2010, and through the National Park at Skaftafell to the Vik area. Enjoy a scenic drive to the lovely blue Lake Mývatn. In one of Iceland's prettiest areas and with volcanic craters throughout the lake, it is teeming with bird life and is known for its geothermal activity. Also, watch how Europe's largest glacier, Vatnajökull, flows into Lake Jökulsárlón, forming icebergs. Iceland is full of natural beauty. Koinonia has also included some out-of-the-ordinary experiences to make your Iceland tour special.



DAY 1: We begin our wonderful journey to Iceland with overnight flight. **DAY 2: ARRIVAL AT KEFLAVIK AIRPORT:** Drive to Reykjavik. On the way to Reykjavik we will stop for breakfast at the Viking World. We will enjoy an informative tour of this capital city and learn about its history before checking into our hotel.

DAY 3: NORTH WEST: We drive northwards via the tunnel of Hvalfjörður to Borgarnes and Skagafjörður, the valley of horses. A visit to the folk museum of Glaumbær, an ancient farm with a turf roof, before continuing via highlands, Öxnadalshéidi, to the capital of the north, in Akureyri.

DAY 4: LAKE MÝVATN AREA: Mývatn is a shallow eutrophic lake in a dramatic landscape dominated by volcanic landforms such as pseudocraters and the lava pillars in Dimmuborgir. Mývatn is a geothermal area with high activity and a place where all your senses will be called upon as we stop at Námaskarð's bubbling sulfur mud-pits and steaming vents. We visit Jarðböðin, the Blue lagoon of the North, where it is possible to experience the warm-mineral rich geothermal water for a refreshing bath. On our way back to Akureyri, we stop at Goðafoss Waterfall. Whale Watching tour from Akureyri in the afternoon.

DAY 5: POWERFUL WATERFALL AND EAST ICELAND: Leaving Akureyri, we drive to the most powerful waterfall in Europe, Dettifoss. We then drive through the highland Plateau Mödrudalsöræfi via Egilsstaðir town towards the sparsely populated and very beautiful Eastfjords with its small fishing villages and magnificent mountains.

DAY 6: FJORDS, GLACIERS AND GLACIER LAGOON: Today we travel along the East Coast with its many fjords and dramatic coastline, passing the villages Djúpvogur and Höfn. We drive along Vatnajökull Glacier before getting to the magnificent Jökulsárlón Glacier Lagoon. Here you have the opportunity for a boat tour for a closer look at the icebergs in the lagoon. From this icy area, we drive to Skaftafell National Park, an enchanting green oasis flourishing between many surrounding glaciers.

DAY 7: SOUTH SHORE BLACK BEACHES AND LAVA FIELDS: Today we cross Eldhraun, the largest mass of lava to have ever flowed on the face of the earth to the famous black beach of Reynisfjara, known for its colony of puffins and unusual rock formations. Along the south shore, we view the fantastic Skógafoss waterfall and the picturesque Seljalandsfoss waterfall. We learn about the forces of volcanic activity at Lava Center before getting to our accommodation.

DAY 8: GOLDEN DAY: The first highlight of the day is Gullfoss, Golden waterfall, which is considered by many to be the most beautiful in the country. The neighboring Geyser hot spring area with the world famous Geyser and Strokkur hot springs and boiling mud pools. Then we continue to visit Þingvellir (Thingvellir) National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage, where the forces of the Great Atlantic Rift are clearly visible with the North American and European tectonic plates, drifting apart at a rate of 2-6 cm per year. It is an area of truly outstanding beauty, as well as geological and historical significance.



DAY 9. Today we must depart Iceland with many wonderful memories of this beautiful country.

Journey to the land of ancient treasures, filled with stunning scenery and adventurous explorations, you'll stand in the very places where the New Testament church began. From the iconic religious sites retracing the footsteps of the Apostle Paul, to historic wonders like the Acropolis in Athens, and a final touch of relaxation as you cruise on the Aegean. This is truly an inspirational journey you will never forget as you follow the path of the Apostle Paul on his missionary journeys. The apostle Paul traveled on 3 missionary journeys, recounted by Luke in the book of Acts. He was imprisoned, shipwrecked and beaten. He witnessed remarkable miracles and built deep relationships with people throughout the Roman Empire. Several years after Paul became a follower of Christ on the road to **Damascus**, a leader in the church named Barnabas found Paul. Barnabas asked him to come to Antioch. Several years later, the church sent out Paul and Barnabas on a missionary journey (Acts 13:1-6).

Day 1 – Today we begin our journey with our overnight transatlantic flight. Get acquainted with fellow travelers and prepare for an awesome experience as we follow the Footsteps of Paul!

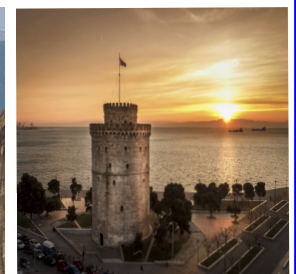
Day 2: ATHENS: We arrive in Athens, the capital of and largest city in Greece. We are greeted by our local guide and enjoy an orientation tour as we travel to the hotel where we stay three nights. The remainder of the day is at leisure. D

Day 3: ATHENS TOUR: Our sightseeing tour of Athens includes the Parliament House, the Academy, Omonia Square and Panathenaic Stadium. We visit the Acropolis, Parthenon, Areopagus, and Mars Hill where Paul delivered his famous sermon about the identity of “the Unknown God” (Acts 17:15-34). We have free time in the area of Plaka in Athens. Later this afternoon we return to our hotel, where you can take time to explore.

Day 4: CORINTH TOUR: With just a short drive, we visit Ancient Corinth. We visit the Bema where Paul stood trial before Gallio (Acts 18:12-17), after spending 18 months working with Aquilia and Priscilla (Acts 18:1-3). Among the ruins see the Temple of Apollo, the Roman Agora, the Bema where St. Paul had to plead his case before the Roman governor Gallio in 52 AD, the pavement inscription of Erastus, the Roman Lachion Road, and the Fountain of Peirene which is the major source of water for Corinth. View the handmade Corinth Canal connecting the Aegean and Ionian Seas. Then we return to Athens for the night.

Day 5: AEGEAN CRUISE: 3 NIGHTS: GREECE & TURKEY ABOARD CELESTYAL CRUISE LINE: We transfer to the port of Piraeus, outside of Athens, to begin our 3-night Greece and Turkey cruise. Step onboard “Celestyal Discovery” for unforgettable sights and fun-filled nights. Spend your very first evening on the island of Mykonos, known equally well for its picturesque windmills and its lively nightlife. A free shuttle bus can take you to the capital for free time to explore.

Day 6: KUSADASI • EPHESUS • PATMOS – ST. JOHN’S MONASTERY • GROTTO OF THE APOCALYPSE: This morning we dock at the Turkish port of Kusadasi, and enjoy an included excursion to Ephesus, whose inhabitants were the recipients of Apostle Paul’s famous epistle (Acts 18:19-26; Ephesians) and which was once the capital of the Roman province of Asia. We return to the ship to sail to Patmos to visit the Monastery of St. John built within the walls of a strong fortification. We see the priceless ecclesiastical treasures housed in the beautiful but small museum: books and manuscripts, mosaics, Icons, splendid medieval textiles and vestments as well as jewelry. We visit the Grotto of the Apocalypse to see the silver niches in the wall that mark the pillow and ledge used as a desk by the author of the Book of the Revelation as well as the three-fold crack made by the voice of God emphasizing the honor of the Holy Trinity. We return to the ship for our evening meal and overnight sailing.



Day 7: SANTORINI: Today we sail to Santorini which is perhaps the most breathtaking of all the Greek Islands. First we head to Megalochori, one of the most authentic and unspoiled villages on the island, retaining its distinctive architecture, character and charm. Our trip continues eastwards through a number of traditional communities like Firostefani and Imerovigli until we arrive at Oia. On our journey, we will have had the lace-like caldera to our west, the small islands of Thirasia, Palea, and Nea Kameni in view, and before us is an incredible, unsurpassable panoramic vista. Here we explore the magical villages of Fira and Oia and photograph the white-washed houses, and blue-blue domed churches perched on caldera cliffs. This evening our cruise sails back to Athens.



Day 8: DISEMBARKATION - DELPHI - KALAMBAKA: After disembarking the cruise our journey continues on to Delphi, the ancient sanctuary of Apollo. Gain a greater understanding of the Greek religious heritage and their influence on the early Christian church during our visit. Marvel at the site of the Charioteer, a bronze statue so delicate we can see his eyelashes. Take a few photos of the Temple of Apollo and Castalia Springs. We continue to Kalambaka for another included dinner and our overnight stop.



Day 9: METEORA - VERIA - THESSALONIKI: Crowning the rocks of Meteora, the "Hanging Monasteries" seem to be suspended in mid-air. Only six of these twenty-four exquisite examples of Byzantine art are inhabited. Our next stop is at Veria (Beroea of the New Testament), where Paul and Silas were sent by friends after being accused of treason in Thessaloniki (Acts 17:5-15). Visit the Bema where Apostle Paul is said to have stood and preached the Gospel to the local community. We continue to Thessaloniki and check into our hotel for a three-night stay.



Day 10: EXCURSION TO PHILIPPI AND KAVALA: We begin our day with a tour along the ancient route of Apostle Paul to Amphipolis (Acts 17:1). We continue our journey to ancient Philippi, which was named after the father of Alexander the Great. This busy Roman colony boasted a great library and theater. In Philippi, Paul preached the gospel, established the first Christian church in Europe, and later wrote an epistle to the Philippians while imprisoned in Rome. (Acts 16:11-40; Philippians). It was in this area that Paul met Lydia, a dealer in purple cloth. She and her household accepted Christ and were baptized in the nearby river (Acts 16:11-15). Next, we continue to Kavala, ancient port of Neapolis (Acts 16:9-11).



Day 11: THESSALONIKI • GUIDED TOUR • Enjoy your day in this seaside city which was considered a world cultural center and an important city of Paul's activities in Northern Greece. It is where he preached and founded a church and to whom he wrote two epistles (Acts 17:1-9; 1 Thessalonians and 2 Thessalonians). We visit the byzantine church of St. Dimitrius and St. Sophia. We see the White Tower along with the Rotonda of Galerius in addition to many other sites. Hopefully we have some time late afternoon for walking by the sea or shopping. Our farewell dinner is at the hotel this evening.



Day 12: FLIGHT HOME: Goodbye Greece & Turkey: Today we will be transferred to the airport to fly back home. WOW, what an unforgettable and inspirational journey that followed the path of the Apostle Paul's missionary journey recounted by Luke in the Book of Acts. Many memories, friends and inspirations to motivate us to serve and share with others.

Day 1: FLIGHT TO DUBLIN, IRELAND: Today we travel to the Airport where we board our overnight flight across the Atlantic to Ireland, the jewel of Western Europe. We are about to begin an exciting journey in this emerald isle with its myths and beauty.

Day 2: ARRIVE DUBLIN • TRINITY COLLEGE • THE BOOK OF KELLS:

We arrive in Dublin and are transferred to our hotel. This afternoon we begin our afternoon tour of Dublin where we see 18th century Georgian houses with brightly painted doors, tranquil parks, and wide O'Connell Street. We take a stroll through Trinity College's campus in the center of the city and view the priceless 9th-century Book of Kells, an illuminated manuscript of the four Gospels. Tonight we join our fellow travelers for a delicious dinner. (D)

Day 3: GLENDALOUGH • DUNBRODY • WATERFORD: After breakfast, we enjoy the delightful scenery of the Wicklow Mountains on the way to 6th century Glendalough, a stunning example of Ireland's beauty. We explore the remains of one of the most important monastic sites in Ireland, founded by St. Kevin in the 6th century. We walk through the deep valley to view the picturesque ruins of a round tower, churches, and Celtic crosses. We head southeast to the Dunbrody Famine Ship, an authentic reproduction of an 1840's vessel that brought desperate Irish emigrants fleeing famine to the New World. We then continue on to our hotel in Waterford, where before dinner we take a gentle guided stroll around the narrow streets of this historic city. (B, D)

Day 4: WATERFORD CRYSTAL • COBH • BLARNEY CASTLE: Today we witness the creation of crystal masterpieces during our visit to the House of Waterford Crystal. We then travel to Cobh for our guided walking tour of this harbor town, which was the last port of call for the Titanic in 1912 and was also the main point of embarkation for Irish emigrants between 1848 and 1960. We proceed to Blarney, to visit Blarney Castle and kiss the famous "Stone of Eloquence" or explore the tranquil gardens. We journey west through rugged countryside for a delicious meal and two night stay in Killarney. (B,D)

Day 5: RING OF KERRY • KILLARNEY: Discover the beauty of this Emerald Isle as our drive takes us through scenery of plunging cliffs and spectacular lakes, between granite mountains and endless beaches on our tour of the Ring of Kerry, Ireland's most scenic coastal drive. We will have plenty of photo stops along the way. We stop for lunch, take a stroll around Sneem and enjoy amazing panoramic views at Moll's Gap. Take a scenic, traditional horse-drawn jaunting car to Ross Castle and the Kenmare Estate. We have the evening at leisure to enjoy a delicious meal at one of Killarney's many restaurants. (B, L)

Day 6: CLIFFS OF MOHER • GALWAY: Today we embark on a ferry ride across the River Shannon Estuary. We then take a scenic drive along the coast of County Clare to view the Cliffs of Moher, which soar almost 700 feet above churning Atlantic swells. You may walk along the top of the cliffs to O'Brien's Tower for great views of Galway Bay and the Aran Islands. We then head to Galway to join a local guide for a brief stroll through the twisting streets of the old city before spending some time on our own. Enjoy an evening at a medieval-style banquet in an authentic Irish castle. (B, D)

Day 7: SHEEPDOG DEMONSTRATION • DONEGAL • DERRY: After breakfast, we immerse ourselves in Irish farm life during a visit to an authentic working farm to watch trained sheepdogs round up mountain sheep. We stop at Donegal to enjoy some free time in this charming town. We meet our local guide in Derry to discover the history of this ancient city that retains its fortified medieval walls dating from 1613. (B, D) **Day 8: GIANT'S CAUSEWAY • TITANIC BELFAST:** Today we explore the northern coastline and the Giant's Causeway, enormous hexagonal columns formed by volcanic activity over 60 million years ago. Tour central Belfast to see Victorian buildings, the imposing City Hall in Donegall Square, and the shipyards where RMS Titanic was built in 1912. We visit Titanic Belfast to learn about the ill-fated ship through state-of-the-art displays. We see the docks where the famous liner was built just over a century ago. We then stop at the Glyde Inn for our dinner with Irish specialties and entertainment featuring traditional Irish music and songs. (B, D)

Day 9: Belfast to Dublin: Down Cathedral • The St Patrick Centre • Crumlin Road Gaol: Today we drive to Dublin and visit Down Cathedral where St Patrick's historical burial site is marked by a huge boulder. Immerse yourself in his work, life, and times in the nearby St Patrick Centre. Explore Crumlin Road Gaol and see what prison life was like through the ages. We visit the Guinness Storehouse and possibly The Irish Emigration Museum before we check into our hotel and relax before our farewell dinner at hotel. (B, D)

Day 10: DEPART DUBLIN: Today we bid farewell to the lovely land of Ireland, departing Dublin International Airport for our return flight to America. (B) **Tour Cost:** \$TBD Plus Air. Includes: Lodging, Deluxe Motor-coach Transportation, Admissions, 16 Meals, Guides and more.



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
