The museum, also located here, contains a rare and beautiful collection of antique phonographs as well as an exhibit depicting the history of electric light. Today in Sarasota we visit the Ringling residence, a million-dollar Venetian Gothic mansion patterned after the Doge's Palace in Venice, Italy. The Art Museum is an Italian-style villa created by local craftsmen from shiploads of columns, doorways, roof sculptures and marble collected in Italy by John Ringling. It has one of the best collections of Baroque art in the western hemisphere. The Museum of the Circus has a collection of circus wagons, calliopes, costumes, handbills and posters covering the history of the circus from Roman times to the present. Day 9. Orlando. Today we travel to Orlando. Orlando, in the center of the Sunshine State, offers experiences like no where else. It's true: Orlando is a magical place. And it's not just because it's home to Cinderella's castle at Walt Disney World. There's an incredible mix of fun things to explore and do in Orlando. We spend 2 nights in Orlando. Day 10. Today will be an open day to enjoy the Orlando area. What will it be? Disney World, Magic Kingdom, Animal Kingdom, Hollywood Studios, Sea World or Epcot. Be amazed, inspired, and entertained! We start our day with a guided tour of Waco, stopping at all the familiar spots from their HGTV's Fixer Upper show. We will see some of their fixer upper homes, visit Jimmy Don's Metal Works and stop by Harp Design Wood Shop. After the tour, we will have free time to have lunch on your own and shopping at Magnolia Market & Silos. Located just a few blocks from the Magnolia Market, the Dr. Pepper Museum is housed in a historic three story bottling plant. Here we will find out about these famous lawmen who have been called one of the most effective investigative law enforcement agencies in the world. We then head south to Fredericksburg and visit The National Museum of the Pacific War, the only institution in the continental United States dedicated exclusively to telling the story of the Pacific Theater Battles of World War II. Hopefully time will allow us to visit Lyndon Johnson National Historic Park and Luckenbach, TX. Day 7: SAN ANTO-

NIO / ALAMO / RIVER WALK. San Antonio is the 7th largest city in the United States and is one of the fastest growing metropolitan areas. We'll understand why when we get a glimpse of this beautiful and unique city as we explore with a guide and enjoy this stately old city. Highlights of the day include a visit to The Alamo, established in 1718 as the city's first mission and called the "Cradle of Texas Liberty." Stops at the Mission San Jose and San Fernando Cathedral will show the influence of the missions. We visit the Institute of Texas Culture, which emphasizes the contributions of the 26 ethnic groups that helped settle Texas. This evening enjoy a relaxing boat ride on the San Antonio River. We drive by the Illinois State Capitol building before visiting the wonderful Library and Museum of President Abraham Lincoln. We see the Chain of the Rocks Route 66 Bridge over the Mississippi River. The bridge was named for the rocks that made crossing the river so rough before the bridge was built in the 1960's.

Day 3: FANTASTIC CAVERNS • SPRINGFIELD • JOPLIN: Missouri is home to more than 6,000 caves including Fantastic Caverns. This is America's only drive through cave. We can relax in comfort by boarding the Jeep-drawn tram and experience the natural beauty. We continue through Missouri on Route 66. Officially recognized as the birthplace of Route 66, it was in Springfield on April 30, 1926 that officials first proposed the name of the new Chicago-to-Santa Monica highway. In 1938, Route 66 became the first completely paved transcontinental highway in America, the "Mother Road," stretching from the Great Lakes to the Pacific Coast. Route 66 runs through downtown Springfield as traces of the Mother Road are still visible in downtown with interesting shops.





Day 4: WILL ROGERS MUSEUM • OKLAHOMA CITY • NATIONAL COWBOY & WESTERN HERIT-AGE MUSEUM • DINNER: Continuing on Route 66, we will be traveling a scenic stretch of the highway known as the Will Rogers Highway. We will be passing through such towns as Commerce, which is the boyhood home of Baseball Hall of Famer, Mickey Mantle. We arrive in Claremore, Oklahoma, the Home of Will Rogers where we stop to visit the Will Rogers Museum. The museum is loaded with memorabilia, his saddle collection, photographs and manuscripts, with nine galleries and three theaters. Also on the grounds is the family tomb located at the sunken garden. Upon arrival in Oklahoma City, we visit the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum. Here we find one of the finest collections of western art in the country, depicting in graphic glory America's Western heritage. The West of Yester-

day Gallery features life-size re-creations of early Indian and pioneer life. The Rodeo Hall of Fame is always a favorite, as is a stroll through the sculpture hall, which features the famous "End of the Trail" and "Coming Through the Rye" sculptures. Don't miss the 33-foot statue of Buffalo Bill. Overnight Oklahoma City. We're in cattle country and steak is on the menu tonight.

Day 5: MURRAH MEMORIAL & MUSEUM • NATIONAL ROUTE 66 MUSEUM • BIG TEXAN STEAK RANCH DINNER: This morning we have a somber reminder of the Oklahoma City tragedy as we visit the Murrah Memorial honoring the 1995 bombing victims. Each of the 168 people killed in the tragedy is represented by a chair made of bronze, stone, and glass. The museum presents the story of this horrendous terrorist attack on April 19, 1995. Continuing on through Oklahoma, we stop in Elk City, Oklahoma at the National Route 66 Museum. This museum takes us on a trip through the route's history with photographs, old signs, and vintage automobiles. We make our way to Amarillo, Texas, where dinner is included at the Big Texan Steak Ranch.



Day 6: CADILLAC RANCH • TUCUMCARI • OLD TOWN ALBUQUERQUE WALKING TOUR: Just outside of Amarillo, we pause for a photo at the famed Cadillac Ranch. This interesting place was built in 1974 by Stanley March III. Here are 10 brightly painted Cadillacs, each of the models from 1949 to 1964 buried nose down in concrete, at the angle of the great pyramids. Our



next stop is in the town of Tucumcari, New Mexico, where we drive through this unique town to see all the murals and pause for a photo at the Route 66 mural, the Tee Pee Curios, and the Blue Swallow Motel. Continuing across the New Mexico Desert, we arrive in Albuquerque, where the spirit of Route 66 still thrives. Nestled amongst the mountains, we take a walking tour of Old Town, the original Albuquerque, to see the old adobe architecture. Founded in 1706, the warmth of aged adobe adds a special charm to its shops and galleries. This evening dinner is included at the 66 Diner. With its 1950's jukebox and blue-plate specials, this place has hardly changed since the heyday of the "Main Street of America" days. **Day 7: SANDIA PEAK AERIAL TRAM • SANTA FE HIGHLIGHTS TOUR • "MIRACULOUS" STAIR-CASE AT LORETTO CHAPEL:** This morning we're off for an exciting ride on the Sandia Peak Tramway, an aerial tram which lofts passengers to the top of 10,000-foot Sandia Peak. The 2.7-mile ride is the longest clear and unsupported span in North America. The view, both east and west, is spectacular! Onto Santa Fe, we enjoy a traditional New Mexico lunch served in one of Santa Fe's gourmet restaurants. After lunch, we get acquainted with downtown Santa Fe as our local guide joins us. We get a great overview of Santa Fe's history, culture and architecture as we navigate the winding streets in and around the downtown plaza. Our knowledgeable guide will share stories about the famous buildings, the significant events and colorful people of Santa Fe's past. Our tour will also include a visit to Loretto Chapel, with its famous "miraculous" staircase, and the Cathedral Basilica of St. Francis, built between 1869 and 1886 in the French Romanesque Style. Next we have free time to enjoy shopping for one-of-a-kind treasures in Santa Fe. Santa Fe is known for its beautiful handmade jewelry.

Day 8: PETRIFIED FOREST NATIONAL PARK • PAINTED DESERT • WILLIAMS • CRUISER'S CAFÉ 66: Traveling through Gallup this morning we see the history of Route 66 on the "Main Drag." See the historic El Rancho Hotel which served as a home base to movie stars such as John Wayne and Katherine Hepburn, who came to the desert for their films. Crossing into Arizona on Route 66, we marvel at the colors of the Painted Desert as it comes into view. Today we visit one of our most unique National Parks, the Petrified Forest. At the Visitor's Center and Rainbow Forest Museum, we see polished sections of the wood. Next, we travel through Holbrook where we see the Wigwam Motel. In Winslow, have a photo taken with the famous bronze statue of "The Man Standing on the Corner." Upon our arrival to Williams, we have an included dinner at the Cruiser's Café 66, a local favorite. We overnight in this charming little town on Route 66.

Day 9: SELIGMAN • KINGMAN • HUALAPAI NATION • GRAND CANYON SKYWALK • INDIAN VIL-LAGE • GUANO POINT: Traveling along Route 66, we stop in Seligman. This delightful town retains all the flavor of the "Mother Road." We stop in town allowing you time to browse the local shops loaded with Route 66 memorabilia and gifts. Maybe we get to visit with Angel Delgadillo, a Route 66 legend. We also pass through Peach Springs, the town that was the inspiration for the Pixar movie Cars. Next we drive through Hackberry, a Route 66 ghost town along the original route. Further ahead, we pass through Kingman, a Route 66 hotspot that has kept the culture alive. From here we journey through the desert oasis to the land of the Hualapai Nation. The Hualapai are a native people of the southwest. If you've never visited the Grand Canvon, vou're in for a treat! Even if vou've been here a dozen times, vou'll stand awestruck at the magnificence of this natural wonder. Our motor-coach takes us to the edge of the Hualapai Nation where we visit the Grand Canyon Skywalk. Here we walk beyond the canyon walls, becoming surrounded by the Grand Canyon-West while standing at the edge of the Glass Bridge. The Glass Bridge is suspended more than 4,000 feet above the Colorado River. We visit an Indian Village consisting of five smaller villages. Our stop at Guano Point offers incredible views of the Grand Canyon and Colorado River. Lunch is included here. Back on our motor-coach we get back on Route 66 and travel to the Colorado River Valley to the resort town of Laughlin, Nevada.

Day 10: MOTHER ROAD MUSEUM • SANTA MONICA • LOS ANGELES: This morning we cross into California making a stop in Barstow to visit the Route 66 "Mother Road" Museum. Displays include development of Route 66 from early pioneer trails, railroads, automotive history, businesses, and other sites. Continuing west toward the coast along the last stretch of the legendary Route 66, we skirt the Mojave National Preserve. We make our way to Santa Monica, known as the end of famous Route 66! We overnight just outside of Los Angeles for the next two nights. Dinner is included this evening.

Day 11: RONALD W. REAGAN LIBRARY & MUSEUM • FARMER'S MARKET • LOS ANGELES CITY TOUR: This morning we visit the Ronald W. Reagan Presidential Library & Museum. Artifacts from his childhood and professional career provide physical evidence of his extraordinary life. A recreated studio booth highlights his early radio broadcasting career. Next, we make our way through the Coconino National Forest into Oak Creek Canyon. Our stop at Oak Creek Canyon Vista allows you to see what awaits you down the road. We travel through spectacular red cliffs, stands of aspen, cedar and oak, and abundant wildflowers to reach the South Rim of the Grand Canyon. The canyon is 7000 feet above sea level. One of the most spectacular examples of erosion anywhere in the world, Grand Canyon is unmatched in the incomparable vistas it offers to visitors on the rim. Enjoy the sights of this natural wonder with its exceptional views and photo opportunities!

Day 4: MONUMENT VALLEY • FOUR CORNERS • MESA VERDE NATIONAL PARK • DURANGO: This morning we pass through Monument Valley. This area provides perhaps the most enduring and definitive images of the American West. The isolated red mesas and buttes surrounded by empty, sandy desert have been filmed and photographed countless times over the years for movies, advertisements & holiday brochures. Because of this, the area may seem quite familiar. The Four Corners is a unique place. It's the only place in America where you can stand in four states at the same time. Located within the Navajo Indian Reservation, this is the exact place where Arizona, Utah, Colorado and New Mexico come together. Mesa Verde, sure to be one of the highlights of our tour, awaits us today. Mesa Verde, Spanish for "green table," is a large plateau towering 2,000 feet above the surrounding valleys, and is famous for the well-preserved, pre-Columbian cliff dwellings in the shallow alcoves of its many canyon walls. We'll stop to explore these dwellings before making our way to Durango, Colorado for the night.

Day 5: DURANGO & SILVERTON NARROW GAUGE RAILROAD: The Durango & Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad, located in Southwestern Colorado, is as rich in history as it is scenery. This railroad, established in 1881, has continuously operated coal-fired, steam-powered locomotives through the remote wilderness and high-mountain landscape of the San Juan National Forest. Here in Durango, we board the historic train for an exciting journey. We spend some time in Silverton where you have lunch on your own in this former frontier silver mining town. All aboard for the return trip. Back in Durango you will enjoy a guided tour of the D&SNG Train Museum.

Day 6: CUMBRES & TOLTEC RAILROAD: We travel to Chama, New Mexico where we board the Cumbres & Toltec Scenic Railroad, America's highest and longest narrow gauge railroad. This 1880's narrow-gauge steam railroad affords outstanding views of the

San Juan and Sangre de Cristo Mountains, Phantom Canyon and the rugged Toltec Gorge. Lunch is included today on the train. This is a 64 mile trip and ends in Antonito, Co. Hopefully all goes well and we will have time to visit the surreal and majestic Great Sand Dunes National Park. Here, massive 700-foot dunes have formed against the backdrop of jagged rocky cliffs and mountains. Then on to Alamosa (Spanish for Cottonwood) which was named for the trees that inhabit this fertile pocket of land by the Rio Grande. This agricultural, mining and educational center of the San Luis Valley sits amid an expansive plateau, 7600 feet above sea level.

Day 7: ROYAL GORGE ROUTE RAILWAY: There are so many beautiful areas to see in Colorado. Today we travel to another famed "Goldrush" town, Cañon City, where silent screen actor Tom Mix began his movie career. Here we ride the Royal Gorge Route Railway for a spectacular rail journey, passing magnificent canyon cliffs rising more than 1000 feet above the Arkansas River. We'll view the amazing Royal Gorge Suspension Bridge, 956 feet above the river. The bridge was completed in 1929, over the "Grand Canyon of the Arkansas" (River). This is a memorable train ride through the Colorado Rockies following the winding Arkansas River.

Day 8: AIR FORCE ACADEMY • GARDEN OF THE GODS: Today we visit the U.S. Air Force Academy. Our stop includes viewing of a B-52 bomber, the renowned Planetarium, Falcon Stadium, a picture stop at the distinctive chapel and other significant sights. Our next stop is the Garden of the Gods, designated as a Natural Landmark. It's known for the stunning geological formations and dramatic views. Next experience the **Pikes Peak Cog Railway**. Since 1891, the world's highest Cog railway ascends 14,115 feet to Pikes Peak. The train winds past waterfalls, through aspen and pine forest. This is an awesome experience like no other. Sit back, relax and check out the amazing views of Pikes Peak and Colorado Springs while ascending Pikes Peak via the cog train! With an average grade of 12%, the Pikes Peak Cog Railway climbs the 14,115 feet to the top of Pikes Peak Mountain on a special track, sometimes hitting a grade of 24%! It's an incredible ride and one you won't forget!

Day 9: DODGE CITY • LUNCH • CASEY'S COWTOWN STEAKHOUSE: Today we leave Colorado and travel across the state of Kansas. We arrive in Dodge City in time for lunch at Casey's Cowtown. We visit Old Dodge City (a.k.a. Boot Hill Museum and Historic Front Street), a history village museum located on the original site of Boot Hill Cemetery. Life in the 19th Century is interpreted through audio-visual programs, exhibits, a reconstruction of Dodge City in 1867, restorations and living history demonstrations. Exhibits in Boot Hill Museum include an extensive old west gun collection; Boot Hill Cemetery where unfortunate victims of the early days of lawlessness were buried; Fort Dodge Jail, one of several original buildings at the fort still in existence; a one-room school; and the 1878 Hardesty House, a restoration of a Victorian era cattleman's home.

Day 10: We travel through the ranch lands of Kansas on our way to **Abilene** to visit the Boyhood home and museum of our 34th president Dwight "IKE" **Eisenhower.** We then make our way to Kansas City and a visit to The **Harry S. Truman Presidential Library and Museum**. This is also the resting place of Harry S. Truman, the 33rd President of the United States, Independence, Missouri.

Day 11: ST. LOUIS, HOMEWARD BOUND: Today we make our way across Missouri through Illinois and Indiana on our way to Elizabethtown, Kentucky: Will make a stop and view **The Gateway Arch**-a 630-foot monument in St. Louis, Missouri. Clad in stainless steel and built in the form of a weighted catenary arch, it is the world's tallest arch, the tallest man-made monument in the Western Hemisphere, and Missouri's tallest accessible building. Optional: The unique tram will lift you 630 feet up to the top of the tallest man-made monument in the United States and take your breath away with the thrilling views and amazing stories. Explore and trace the story of the Native Americans, explorers, pioneers,









and rebels who made America possible. The museum features six themed exhibit areas; this innovative and interactive museum celebrates America's pioneering spirit. Stand in the footsteps of American heroes at the beautifully restored federal courthouse.

Folk art, impressionist paintings, circus collections, and even a steamboat—it's all here on the beautifully landscaped campus of historic buildings and galleries, each one filled with fascinating collections. Day 5: Vermont: Big Day in a small state. Today is a day of tasting: Watch apples transform into cider the old fashion way-using a rack and cloth press-during our stop at the Cold Hollow Cider Mill. Day 2: JIM THORPE • THE OLD JAIL • MAUCH CHUNK MU-SEUM • ASA PACKER MANSION • ST MARK'S CHURCH:

Established in 1818 as Mauch Chunk, the town was later named Jim Thorpe after the legendary Native American athlete. Here, entrepreneurs led by Josiah White formed the Lehigh Coal & Navigation Company in the 1820s, and shipped countless tons of anthracite coal and



other goods to market via the Lehigh and Delaware Canals. The town grew in importance when it was named Carbon County's seat in 1843.Its steep hillsides, narrow streets, and terraced gardens earned the town its nickname "The Switzerland of America." The beauty of this region has beckoned people for almost two centuries. We step back in time to this Victorian town and hear Stories of the famous and infamous. Our first stop is the Old Jail Museum, as you hear about the ill-fated Molly Maguires. We then visit the Mauch Chunk Museum, the incredible Asa Packer Mansion and St. Mark's Church to hear stories of the town's wealthy forefathers. With this town's narrow streets & neat boutiques, you won't believe you're not in Europe! Our overnight accommodations await us for a three night stay.

Day 3: DORFLINGER GLASS • STOURBRIDGE TRAIN • BUSHKILL FALLS: The Dorflinger Glass Museum is a tribute to the life and accomplishments of Christian Dorflinger, known throughout the world as the creator of fine crystal and exquisite cut glass. The museum gift shop is stocked with an assortment of glass souvenirs, gifts and collectibles; everything from colorful paperweights and miniatures to jewelry, American Studio Glass and lovely hand-crafted ornaments. Today we enjoy more of the beautiful Poconos aboard the Stourbridge Train for a scenic ride along the Lackawaxen River Gorge. Next, Bushkill Falls, known as "The Niagara of Pennsylvania," has been open since 1904 and encompasses about 300 acres with eight waterfalls and more than two miles of trails, bridges and walkways. The drop of the Main Falls is approximately 100 feet. From the top of the first falls to the bottom of the lower gorge, the drop is about 300 feet. Bushkill Falls is among the Keystone State's most famous scenic attractions. We''ll want to hike the trails to view the towering 100- foot Main Falls, affording fabulous views of the falls and the forest.
